



What to Expect During Construction: Tenderloin

Overview

The Geary Rapid Project aims to improve pedestrian safety and transit reliability along Geary and parts of O'Farrell from Stanyan to Market streets. Work east of Van Ness Avenue is being completed by contractor Mitchell Engineering and is managed by San Francisco Public Works. This work is expected to be completed in mid-2021 and includes:

- Water main replacement on Geary Street from Van Ness to Kearny
- Pedestrian bulbs sidewalk extensions that make crossing distances shorter at intersection corners on:
 - O'Farrell Larkin, Hyde, Leavenworth, Jones
 - Geary Larkin, Hyde, Leavenworth, Jones, Mason
- Lengthening the **bus bulb** on O'Farrell between Jones and Taylor
- Pedestrian countdown signals installed at O'Farrell and Leavenworth
- Inbound O'Farrell/Larkin bus stop relocation to farside (east) of intersection



What to Expect

Work hours are typically Mondays – Fridays between 7 a.m. and 4 p.m. Parking will be temporarily restricted in construction areas and traffic lanes will be modified during active work. Bus stops may be temporarily relocated.


Water main installation has started at Van Ness Avenue and will move east along Geary Street towards Market Street. Water main work is expected to take about 1-3 months per block. After new pipes have been installed, water service to some properties may be briefly shut off while SFPUC connects to the new water main. SFPUC will coordinate with businesses and send out water shut-off notices in advance of any service interruption.

Sidewalk extensions ("bulbs") and traffic signal work will follow after water work has been completed on a block and is expected to take up to a few weeks per location.

Pedestrian bulbs help make people walking more visible to cars and shorten crossing distances.

Access to businesses will be maintained throughout, and there will be pedestrian detours.
