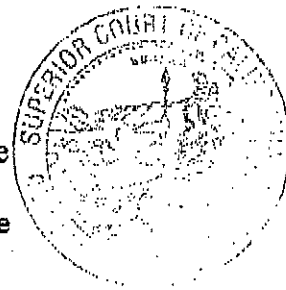

Judgment having been entered in this proceeding on June 18, 2007, ordering that a  
peremptory writ of mandate shall issue from this Court,

YOU ARE HEREBY COMMANDED immediately on receipt of this Writ to  
set aside your June 7, 2005 Board of Supervisors' Ordinance No. 109-05, adopting the  
Bicycle Plan, and to set aside all other legislation or acts adopting or implementing the  
Bicycle Plan or any component of it, consistent with this Court's Judgment Granting



1 Preemptory Writ of Mandate filed on June 18, 2007. For purposes of this Writ, the Bicycle  
 2 Plan consists of the "Framework document" adopted on June 7, 2005, the "Network  
 3 Improvement Document," their entire contents, including maps, charts, tables, and  
 4 illustrations, and all legislative acts by the City to approve, adopt or implement any action  
 5 named, illustrated or described in them since June 7, 2005.

7 YOU ARE HEREBY FURTHER COMMANDED to reevaluate the Bicycle Plan and  
 8 every part of it as defined above, and any subsequent actions implementing any part of it, in  
 9 compliance with the requirements of CEQA.

10 Under Public Resources Code § 21168.9(b), this Court shall retain jurisdiction over  
 11 the public agency's proceedings by way of a return to the preemptory writ until the Court has  
 12 determined that the City has complied with CEQA.
