Double parking in front of school and blocking driveways. 4. Speeding on 18th Ave south of Lincoln Way. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. People wanting to avoid the backup at WB Kirkham onto SB 19th Ave use this to get around. Peds not expect this. 3. Double parked cars obscure sight distance for peds crossing mid-block and circulation around area. 4. Fast cars come off of Lincoln and continue speed on 18th Avenue.
