Event at Chase Center

Thursday, March 27 to Saturday, March 29: The Pac-12 Conference will host the West Regional of the NCAA Division, Men's Basketball Championship at Chase Center.

- **Thursday, March 27:** The <u>NCAA Men's Basketball Champion, The Sweet 16</u> will take place. Show will begin at 4:30 p.m. Doors will open at 3 p.m.
- **Saturday, March 29:** Winners of the two Thursday games will advance to face each other on this day. The <u>NCAA Men's Basketball Champion, Final</u> will take place with start time to be determined.

Supplemental Muni Service

- Muni will operate supplemental 78X Arena Express service.
- *Pre-event express shuttle service* from 16th Street BART Station to Chase Center will start two and a half hours before each game/event and will end one hour after game/event starts.
- *Post-event express shuttle service* from Chase Center on 16th Street to 16th Street BART Station will run until the area clears.

Special Event Parking Rates

During basketball games and other major events with more than 10,000 expected attendees at the arena, parking meters close to the arena will charge a special event rate of \$11 per hour. These rates help reduce congestion and keep parking spots available in the neighborhoods near the arena, discouraging circling for free or cheap parking. Start times for special event rates vary based on the start time of the event. More information on special event parking regulations can be found on <u>www.sfmta.com/special-event-parking</u>.

Street Closures

To accommodate events that will take place at the arena, the following street closures will be enforced two hours before and one hour after each event:

- 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Northbound 3rd Street between 16th Street and Warriors Way will also be closed approximately 30 minutes before and 45 minutes after an event.
- Only local access will be allowed on Northbound Illinois Street between Mariposa and 16th streets.

No Parking Zone

To facilitate loading and pick up for Muni customers and patrons, NO PARKING will be in effect at these locations during events:

- 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Between the 500 and 700 blocks of Terry Francois Boulevard (TFB)

Taxi Stands

There is one taxi stand located on southbound Terry Francois Boulevard. Ramp Taxis should use the loading zone on eastbound Warriors Way at Bridgeview Way.

Other pickup/drop-off locations near Chase Center

- 4th Street, which connects to Chase Center via the Gene Friend Way pedestrian path on the UCSF campus.
- Owens Street, which also connects to Chase Center via the Gene Friend Way pedestrian path on the UCSF campus.

CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES

UPDATED: Telegraph Hill Boulevard and Coit Tower Parking Lot Reconstruction Project

As part of San Francisco Public Works' Telegraph Hill Boulevard and Coit Tower Parking Lot Reconstruction project, their agency crew will upgrade streets and sidewalks in the Coit Tower area.

Some of this work will require Muni's <u>39-Coit</u> route to be temporarily shortened.

The 39-Coit route will not serve Lombard Street, Telegraph Hill Boulevard or Coit Tower during these times:

- Thursday, March 13 until Friday March 28: To accommodate reconstruction of the outer ring of the parking lot on top of Telegraph Hill Boulevard
- Monday, April 7 until Friday, April 11: Anticipated closure to accommodate street base work and repaving on Telegraph Hill Boulevard (subject to change)

The closest<u>39-Coit</u> stop to Coit Tower will be at Union and Montgomery streets. To access stop, customers should use the stairs at Filbert Street between Telegraph Hill Boulevard and Montgomery Street.

Riders along the missed segments of the 39-Coit route can use the stops at Stockton & Lombard or Union & Montgomery.

UPDATED: Valencia Street Bikeway Improvements

Paving is tentatively scheduled to begin on Monday, March 31. Public Works will repave the center of Valencia Street, where the center-running bike lane was. Crews will grind existing roadway and then lay new asphalt. *While paving is happening on your block, you will not be able to park on Valencia. Pay attention to signs telling you where not to park.*

Work is anticipated to take one or two days per block, with the total paving time anticipated to be between eight to ten days for the whole Valencia Street corridor between 15th and 23rd streets. Work during paving may start as early as 6:30 a.m.

There will always be a lane of traffic available in each direction. Please note that there will be some noise and dust, but dust mitigation measures will be in place. Once paving is completed, we will begin installing the new side-running bike lanes.

Masks are no longer required, but are encouraged in any SFMTA facilities, transit hubs or on vehicles including Muni buses, streetcars, light rail vehicles or cable cars or in taxis or on paratransit.

ONGOING: Changes to the 30S Stockton Route

Effective Saturday, March 15, with an ongoing effort to manage financial challenges while maintaining reliable transit service for riders, the SFMTA will adjust Muni <u>Short</u> service. As part of these efforts, the SFMTA will implement changes to the 30S Stockton Short route to reduce redundancy while enhancing and maintaining robust service between Chinatown and SoMa.



ONGOING: Changes to the 30S Stockton Route continued

Key Changes to the 30S Stockton Short Route

Initially, the SFMTA proposed reducing southbound service on the 30S Stockton Short from Post Street to the Caltrain Station, where the 30 Stockton, 45 Union/Stockton and T Third routes already providing service. However, after receiving valuable community feedback, the SFMTA modified the timing and routing of these changes:

- Starting Saturday, March 15, the 30S Stockton Short southbound will turn left at Folsom Street, left on Third Street, and then rejoin its original northbound route.
- Riders traveling to Caltrain Station can continue using the 30 Stockton, 45 Union/Stockton, and T Third buses.

This change will allow the SFMTA to use the same resources to provide more transit coverage. It does, however, result in slightly less frequent service on the revised 30S Stockton Short route.

ONGOING: Permanent Roadway Closures of Great Highway and Great Highway Extension Southbound

Starting on Friday March 14, Great Highway will be permanently closed from Lincoln Way to Sloat Boulevard for Ocean Beach sand movement and to construct a new park. Great Highway Extension, southbound, from Sloat Boulevard to Skyline Boulevard will also be permanently closed. ONGOING: Cable Car Sheaves Upgrade Project

Beginning Tuesday, Feb. 18, crews will be restoring the cable car system sheaves, which are massive, grooved wheels that guide the underground cables through specialized pulley systems.

These upgrades will take place from Tuesday, Feb. 18 and will continue through May 2025. During this work,

- there will be occasional closures of individual cable car segments;
- bus shuttles will replace cable car lines where work is being done;
- at least one cable car route will remain open to the public during normal operating hours while sections are being upgraded.

ONGOING: Essential Trip Card Discount Program

The SFMTA's program, Essential Trip Card (ETC) Program, assists people with disabilities and older adults to make essential trips using taxis. The program provides two to three round trips at an 80% discount per month, i.e. rider pays \$6 to receive a value of \$30 or pays \$12 to receive a \$60 value. If essential needs require it, riders may receive additional value up to \$120 of taxi service per month.

To qualify for the program, customer must be either age 65 or older or an adult with disabilities. Eligible adults may apply for the ETC program by calling the Paratransit Mobility Management office at 415-351-7053.
