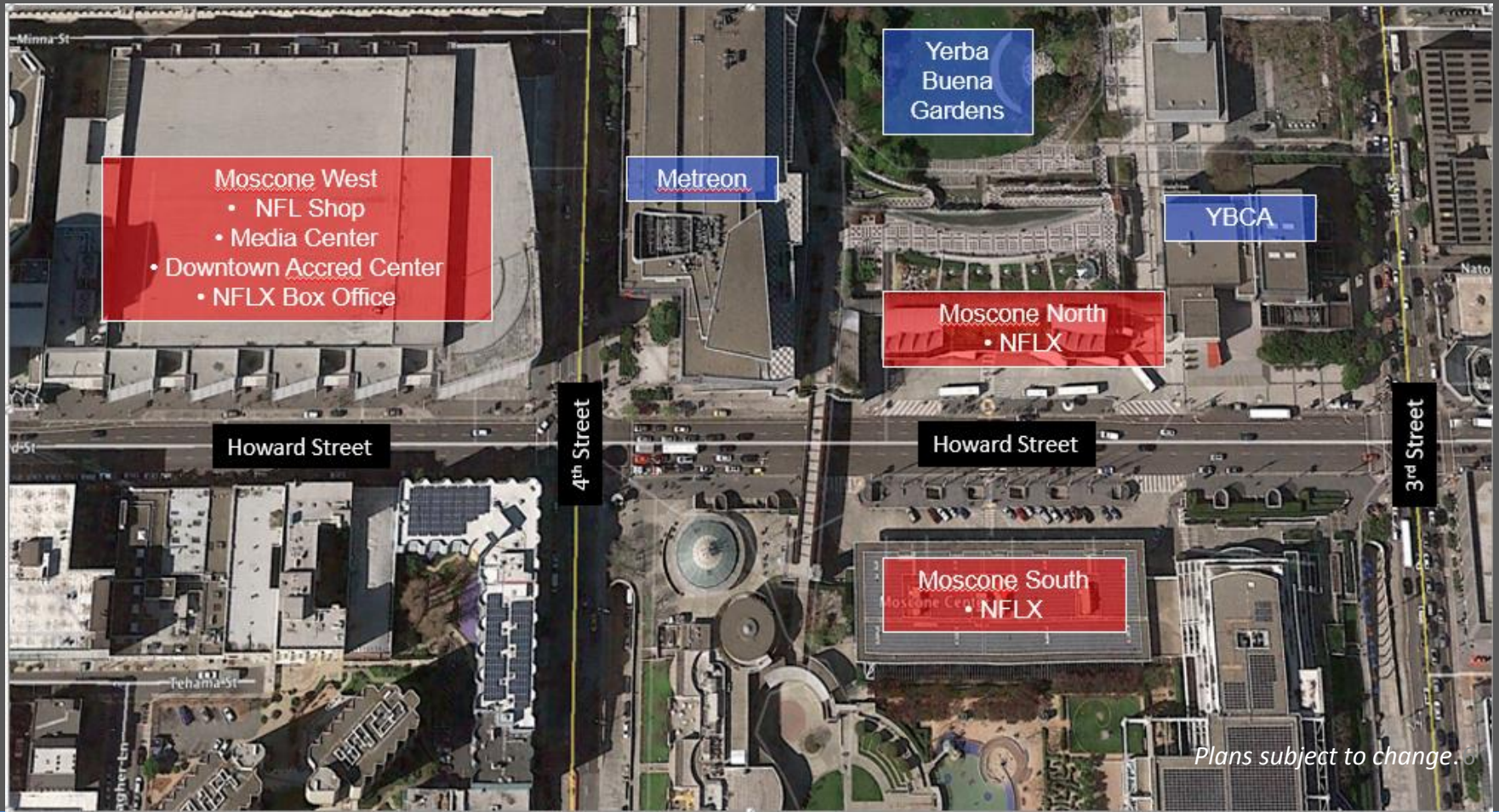

KEY DATES

- **Super Bowl City: January 30 – February 7**
 - Lower Market Street from Beale to Steuart Streets
 - Justin Herman Plaza & Sue Bierman Park to Don Chee Way
 - Southbound Embarcadero from Washington to Don Chee Way & Harry Bridges Plaza
- **NFL Experience: January 30- February 7**
 - Moscone Center & Howard from 3rd to 4th
- Staging to begin about ***one week before*** and removal to occur for about ***5 days after*** events.






TRANSIT OBJECTIVES

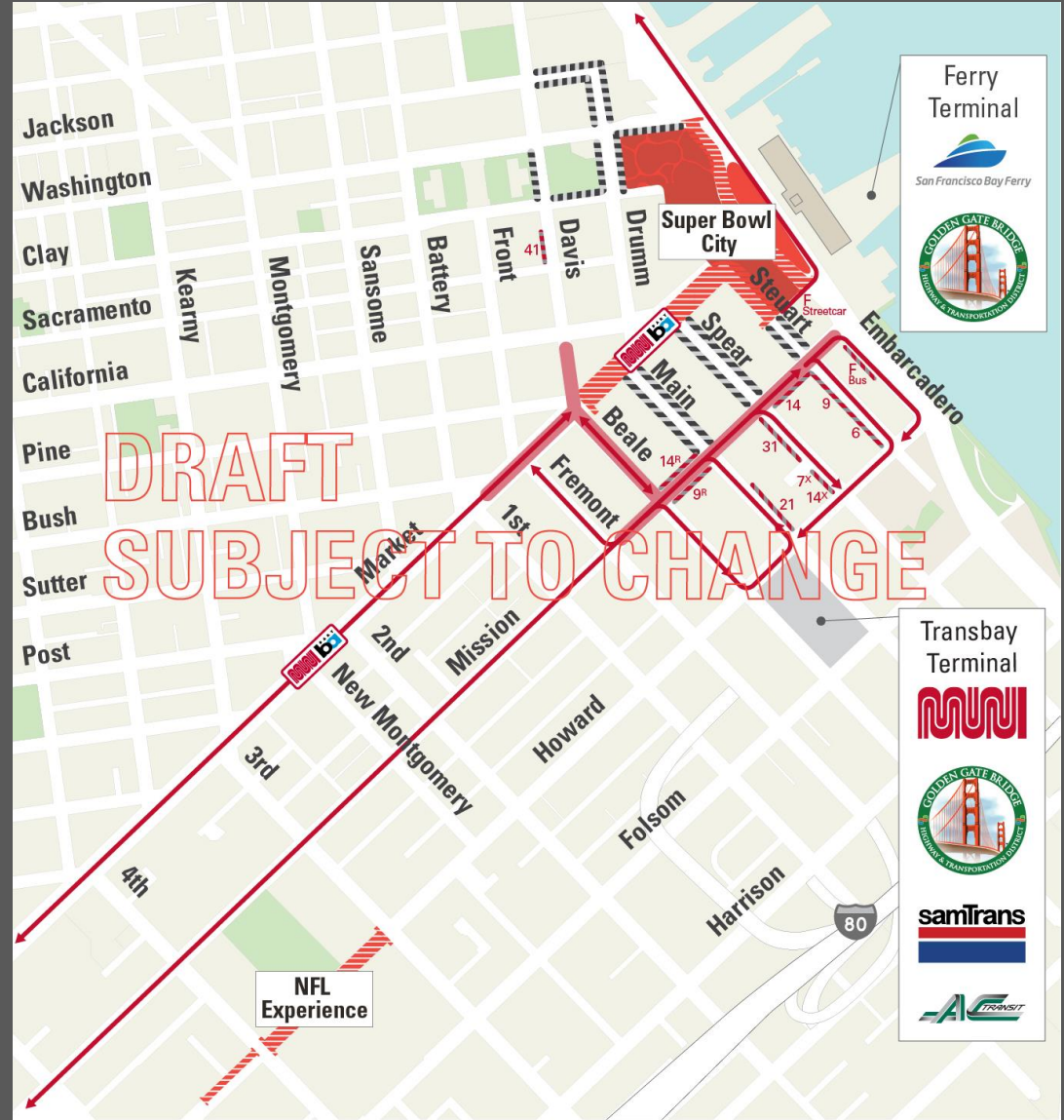
1. Keep the city *safe, secure* and *moving* during Super Bowl 50 activities
2. Ensure those who *live and work* in SF can get to where they are going with minimal disruptions, and visitors can get to and from events safely and easily without a car

TRANSIT DOWNTOWN

- All Muni lines will operate downtown, except the E-line.
 - Some bus lines that run downtown will be rerouted to nearby streets
- Regional transportation providers will be accommodated on nearby streets
- Autos and parking will be limited downtown to accommodate transit routes and emergency vehicles

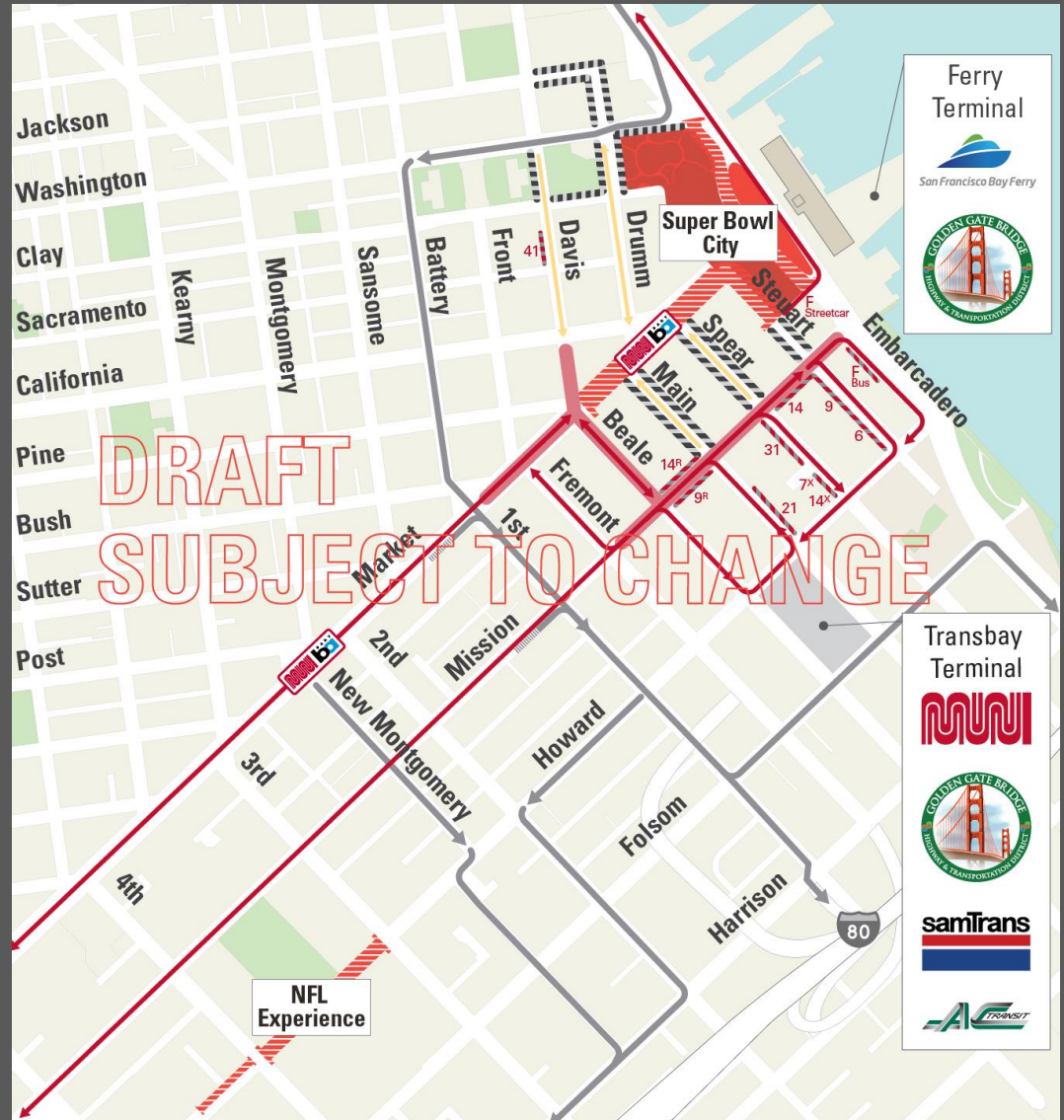
