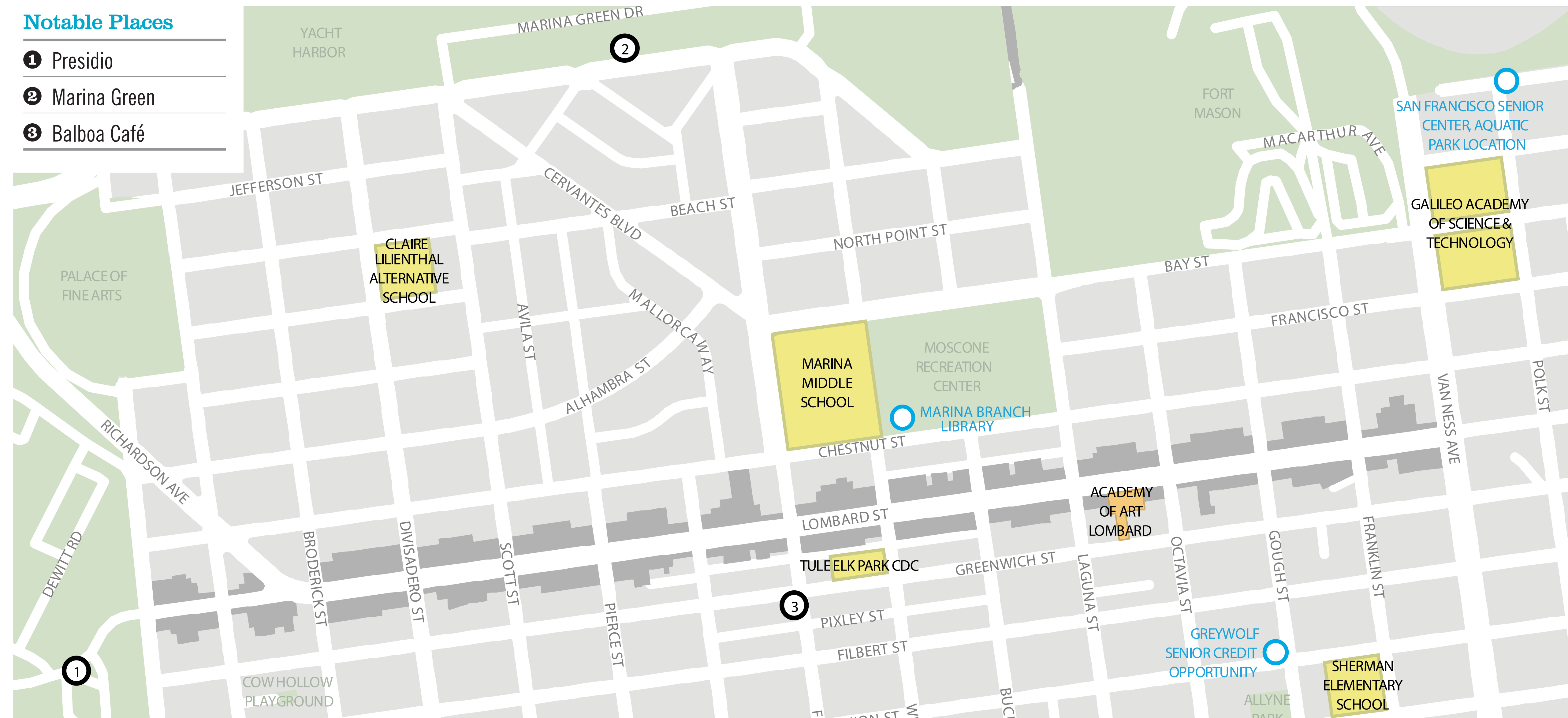
# Invest in Lombard!

## About the Corridor

- » Lombard Street is part of US Route 101 and is also a commercial corridor that connects to the Golden Gate Bridge, Presidio, Palace of Fine Arts, Bay Trail, and Fort Mason.
- » The district is a hub for hotels and motels but also includes mixed-use residential and commercial buildings, auto shops, diners and some convenience shopping.
- » Over 80,000 pedestrians travel along or across Lombard St each day, of which nearly 5,000 are walking to/from transit stops. Lombard is a Vision Zero High Injury Corridor with 150+ pedestrian and vehicle collisions between 2008-2012.

## Challenges on Lombard Street

### 1 Safety for People walking

- » Lombard part of City's High Injury Network
- » High volume of people walking



### 2 Aging Street Infrastructure & Physical Conditions Need Repair

- » Signage needs facelift
- » Graffiti on buildings



### 3 Slow and unreliable Muni Service

- » Frequent sideswipe collisions



## Project Goals

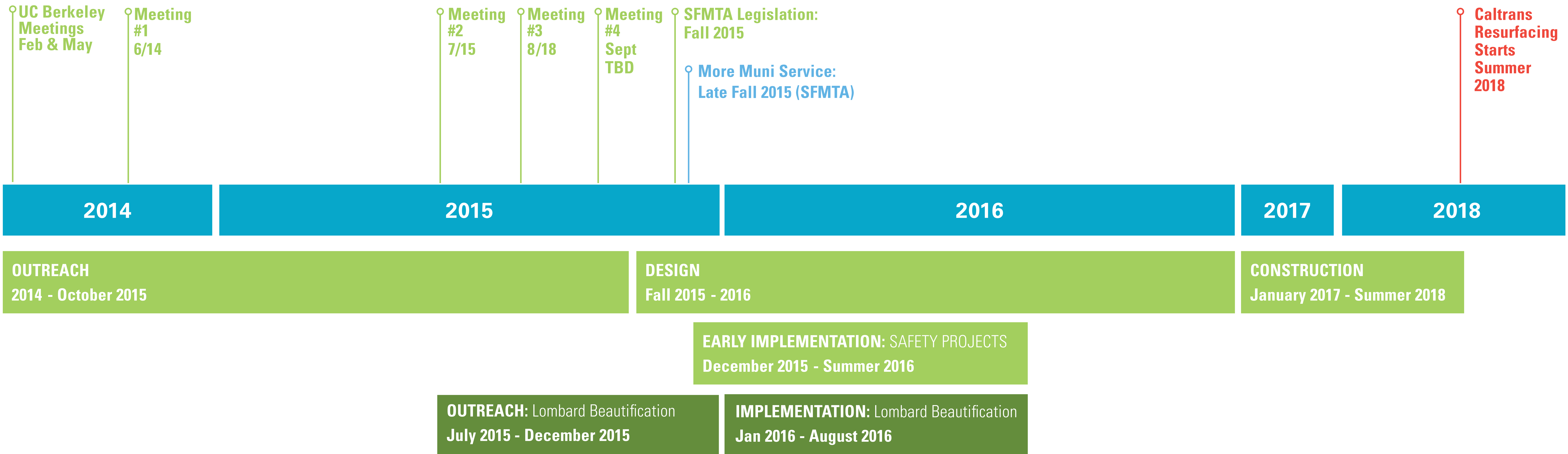
- » Work with the community to improve Lombard Street and enhance its vibrancy for neighbors, merchants, and visitors.
