



Commuter Shuttle Program

24th Street Community Open House

Tuesday, April 18, 2017, 6-8pm • Noe Valley Library Meeting Room

The SFMTA is holding an open house about shuttle stop placement along 24th Street. There is no set agenda, so community members are welcome to drop by the library at any time between 6 and 8pm to talk to staff and provide feedback on where shuttle stops should be located along the corridor.

Background

Commuter shuttles over 35 feet in length are required to travel only on state-designated arterial streets. 24th Street is the only east-west arterial street in the Noe Valley neighborhood, so shuttle activity is concentrated on that corridor.

The only eastbound shuttle stop on 24th Street is a shared Muni zone at Church Street. This stop is not long enough to accommodate the number of shuttles and Muni buses in the morning, leading to Muni blockages and safety issues. A separate, longer shuttle white zone is needed along 24th Street to address these concerns.

Getting There

The Noe Valley Library is located at 451 Jersey Street, between Castro and Diamond Streets. It is served by the 24-Divisadero and 48-24th Street Muni bus lines at 24th and Castro Streets. The meeting room is on the ground floor. Street parking is limited. This location is accessible.

What is the Commuter Shuttle Program?

The Commuter Shuttle Program provides permitted employer-operated shuttles access to a limited network of Muni and white zones when shuttle operators meet a number of requirements, including:

- Driver safety training
- vehicle emissions standards
- Limiting larger shuttles to arterial streets
- Labor harmony
- Compliance with all state and local regulations
- Per-stop fees that pay for enforcement, program administration, and capital improvements
