#### ACCESSIBLE MEETING POLICY

3. Announcement of prohibition of sound producing devices during the meeting.

Board Secretary Boomer announced that the ringing of and use of cell phones, pagers and similar sound-producing electronic devices are prohibited at the meeting. She advised that any person responsible for the ringing or use of a cell phone, pager, or other similar sound-producing electronic devices might be removed from the meeting. She also advised that cell phones that are set on "vibrate" cause microphone interference and requested that they be placed in the "off" position.

# 4. Approval of Minutes

6. Introduction of New or Unfinished Business by Board Members

Chair Heinicke asked staff to honor Rosa Parks with a commemorative seat on Muni buses.

Director Torres requested an update on the Randall Street bike share location. Chair Heinicke stated that this is larger than one location. Vice Chair Borden requested information about the process; how locations are identified; criteria for evaluating a location and alternatives; and the timeframe for installation.

Director Brinkman requested information regarding the lack of access on Howard Street during large events.

# 7. Director's Report (For discussion only)

Ed Reiskin, Director of Transportation, discussed the Vision Zero Strategy; Geary Rapid Project groundbreaking; the Potrero Yard project workshops, and reopening Stockton Street.

Julie Kirschbaum, acting Director, Transit, presented an update on transit service.

Vice Chair Borden suggested using the City's alert system to communicate system delays.

Chair Heinicke asked staff to provide trip time between West Portal and the Embarcadero as part of the report. He asked staff to explore closing the West Portal intersection to traffic in the morning before businesses open and to report back on the loop proposal.

# PUBLIC COMMENT:

Herbert Weiner noted a problem in the subway. On weekend evenings, there's a lack of service. Vehicles are crowded with many people squeezed in. The issue is not only the gaps in service but also the accommodation of passengers. There were issues with the 1 California line last week.

# 8. Citizens' Advisory Council Report

Neil Ballard, Chair, Finance and Administration Committee, Citizens' Advisory Council, presented the report.

#### 9 Public Comment

Herbert Weiner discussed difficulties he experienced with getting a Clipper Card. He was passed around to various agencies. He was told he would get a new Clipper Card in ten days. He spent over an hour on the phone. This reflects on the internal operation of the SFMTA. The L Taraval line is in shambles. There's been no improvement in service and it's been a total disaster.

Mike Spain stated that at the last meeting, there was discussion about the medallions held by the credit union. These medallions are being leased by the credit union now. Everybody wants them. The credit

union is the beneficiary of the new policy. There's been a change in the list of medallion holders. He wondered if the credit union had possession of the medallions.

Matt Brezina discussed the Castro Station elevator project. He and his family have seen a delay in the project for over a year due to an active group who wants to redesign the plaza. He's now hearing that the project is being delayed again. This is critical infrastructure. The other elevator isn't reliable and it's across a busy section of Market Street. He asked staff to not delay the project further

Philip Brady discussed the use of broad band alarms on vehicles. He was contacted about the use of them by a private contractor. There are a few buses in his neighborhood that are extremely loud. He has been in touch with staff but the issue remains. Setting off a 90+ decibel alarm near a home is intense. Broad band alarms will quiet the beeping noise from vehicles that are backing up.

Austin Peterson asked what percent Clipper takes for their fee. Better Muni would equal better taxi service and vice versa. He would like to see taxis accept the Clipper Card as payment. This would be a carrot for taxis as opposed to the stick being used at the airport.

Ali Vahabzadeh discussed the cessation of Chariot services. The several thousand passengers who used to take Chariot are trying to find space on Muni. It's not good. He asked the Board how they plan to make up the capacity constraints. He hasn't been able to board the bus, especially during the am and pm commute periods.

Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.
