The Bayview Community Based Transportation Plan (Bayview CBTP) seeks to **improve mobility, safety, and access to opportunities** in the culturally rich and resilient Bayview community by identifying **transportation solutions** tailored to the needs of **residents, community-based organizations and businesses.**

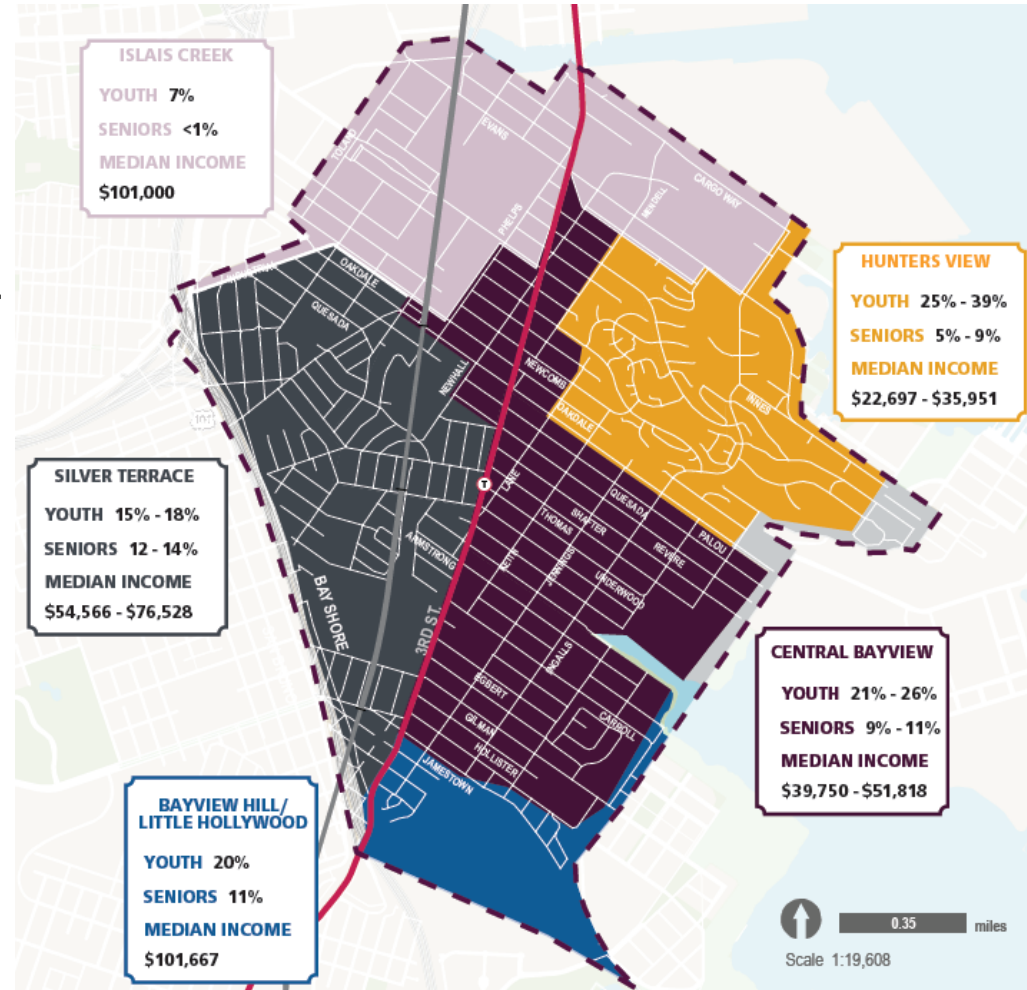

PROJECT APPROACH

- Partner with community-based organizations and **we follow their lead** (BMAGIC, Hunters Point Family, CYC & El Centro)
- Develop holistic solutions that **help the current community** grow & thrive into the future
- Prioritize solutions for those **most vulnerable to transportation changes**. Residents define whom are most vulnerable in the Bayview.
- Outreach events designed to **meet people where they are** and to **reduce meeting overload**

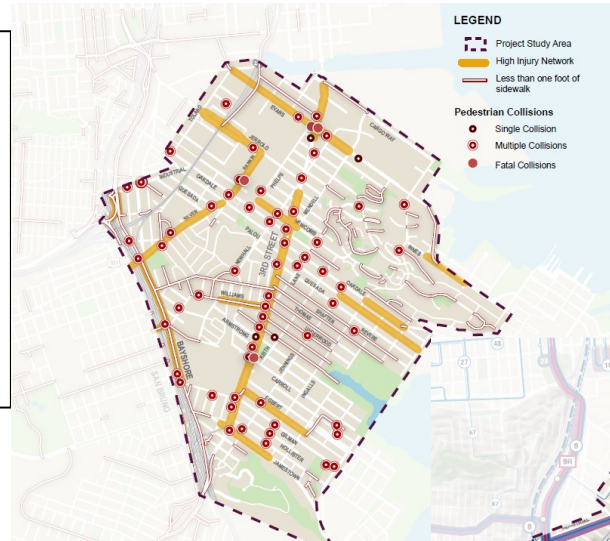

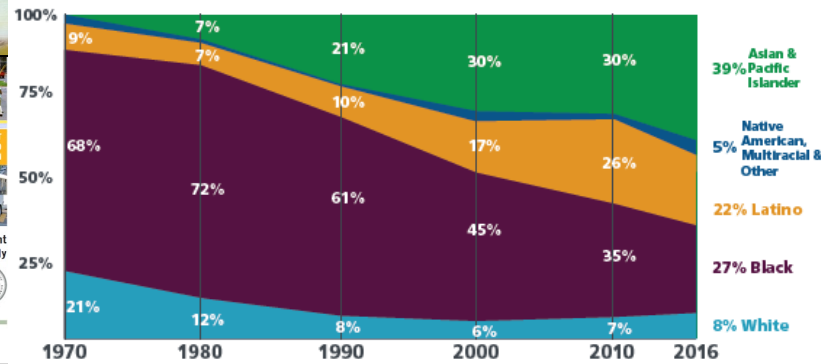

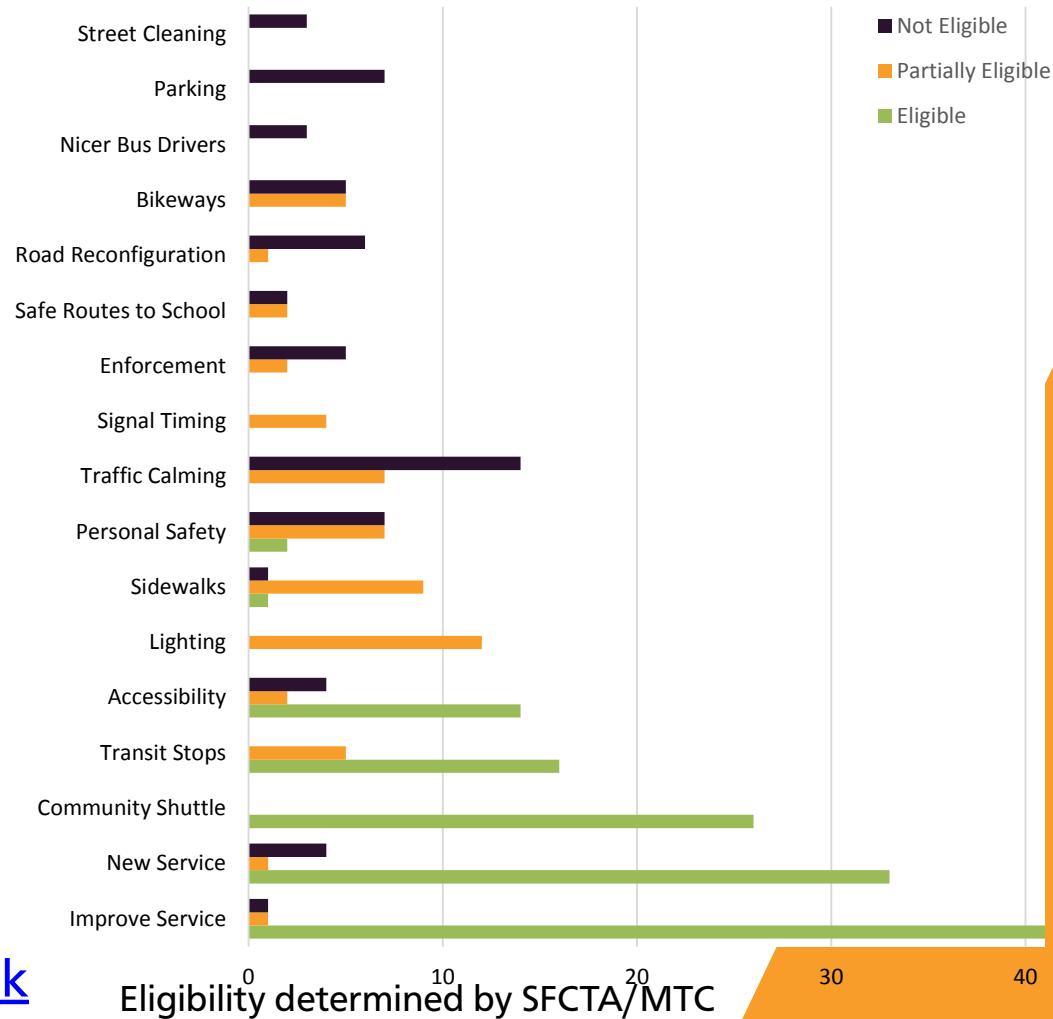

PROJECT PREFERENCE WORKSHEET

In the fall of 2018, we asked over 1,500 Bayview residents:
What streets do we need to focus on for repairs, safety improvements, and investment?
 Now that we've identified Priority Corridors - what kind of improvements do you want?

3rd Street

More residents identified 3rd Street as a priority than any other street. Residents comments/priorities included:

- Improve pedestrian safety
- A better bike route
- Better T-stations
- Support the African American Cultural District
- Better lighting
- Improve parking management on 3rd St & side-streets

Should we... (choose one)

- Equal focus between 3rd St and other Bayview streets
- Focus less on 3rd St and more on other Bayview Streets

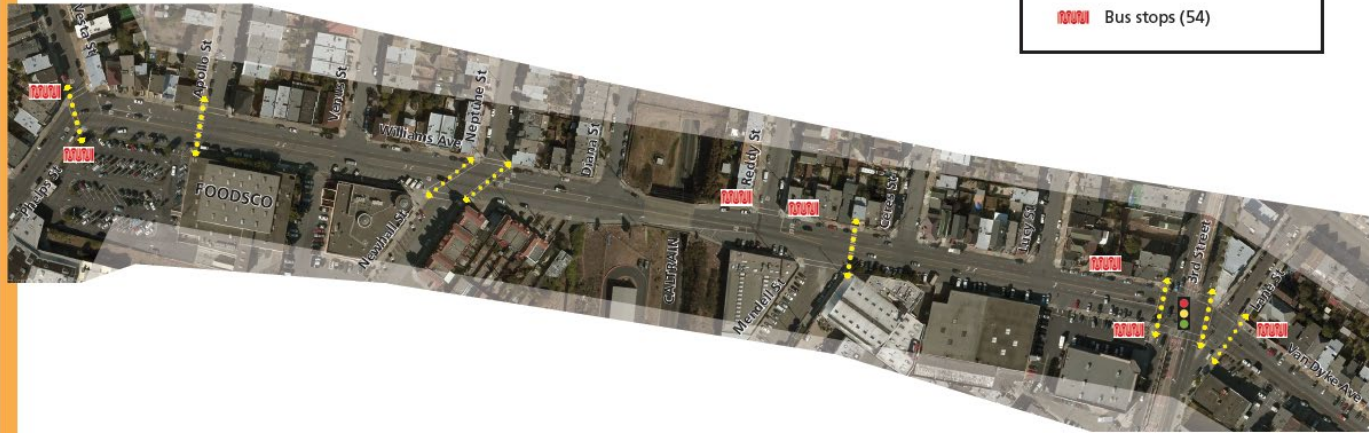

Southeast Muni Expansion

**PHASE 2 –
INPUT TONIGHT**

- **10 bus route options** to expand Muni service to the Bayview and Candlestick Point-Hunters Point Shipyard
- **2-3 most popular routes** funded through developer contributions
- Service likely to start **2021-2023**

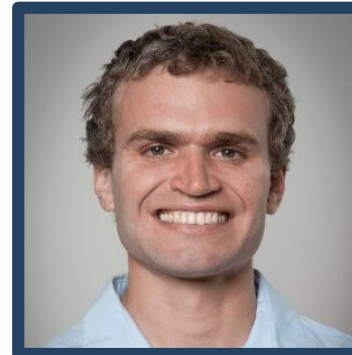

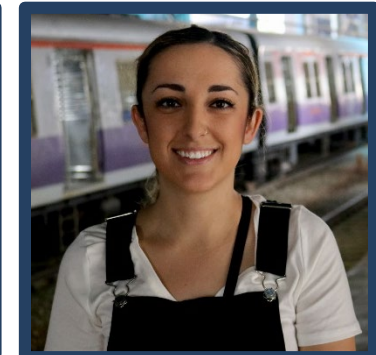
