

# Proposed Safety and Transit Stop Spacing Improvements on Church Street

SFMTA Board of Directors October 15, 2024

#### **Overview**

- Church/28<sup>th</sup> streets saw a spike in collisions from 2019-2022
- Safety improvements have reduced collisions since 2022, but intersection is still a safety concern for residents, who have requested all-way stop sign
- We have developed a proposal to create more evenly spaced J Church stops, including one at 28<sup>th</sup> Street
  - Improves overall stop spacing
  - Allows for an all-way stop sign at Church/28<sup>th</sup> streets without delaying trains



#### **Proposal**

- Install all-way stop sign at Church and 28<sup>th</sup> streets
- Shift two J Church stops:
  - Clipper shifts to 26<sup>th</sup>
  - 27<sup>th</sup> shifts to 28<sup>th</sup>
- J Church would serve every even-numbered street on Church from 14<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup>
- Future Muni Forward project will evaluate reliability improvements, such as transit priority signals, in collaboration with Noe Valley community



## **Community engagement**

- **2020 present:** extensive communication with community members about safety improvements at Church/28<sup>th</sup> streets
- August 2024: staff worked closely with D8 office and reached out to Noe Valley stakeholders on proposal through merchant canvassing, mailers, postering Church St, direct emails/calls
- **September 6, 2024:** proposal presented at Engineering Public Hearing
  - Received ~120 comments, ~75% in support
- September 18, 2024: staff presented to Upper Noe Neighbors community meeting
  - 20+ attendees generally expressed support for adding all-way stop to Church/28<sup>th</sup> in conjunction with J Church stop spacing improvements as proposed







# What you're voting on today

- Approving an all-way stop sign at Church and 28<sup>th</sup> streets
- Moving the existing J Church stops at Clipper and 27<sup>th</sup> streets to 26<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> streets to create balanced, easy-to-understand transit stop spacing that aligns with the new stop sign



### Next steps

- October 15, 2024: SFMTA Board consideration (today)
- Fall 2024: If approved, implementation of all-way stop sign at Church/28<sup>th</sup> streets and transit stop relocations at Church/26<sup>th</sup> and Church/28<sup>th</sup> streets



#### Ongoing improvements to the J Church

#### Past improvements to the J Church

- Church Street (16<sup>th</sup> to Duboce) red transit lanes (2013)
- Quick-build transit lanes on San Jose Ave. (2024)
- Church/Market quick-build transit plaza improvements (2020-2023)

#### Coming soon

- Permanent transit plaza improvements at Church/Market (2026)
- Transit boarding islands and safety upgrades on San Jose Ave. (2026)
- Evaluate further J Church reliability and safety improvements in Noe Valley (2025)
