- Taxis are not exempt from any of these regulations.
- The proposed parking and traffic modifications have been reviewed pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).
- The proposed action is the Approval Action for Items A-K as defined by S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31.

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PURPOSE

To approve various routine parking and traffic modifications.

STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS AND TRANSIT FIRST POLICY PRINCIPLES:

- 1. Make streets safer for everyone.
- 2. Deliver reliable and equitable transportation services.
- 3. Eliminate pollution and greenhouse gas emissions by increasing use of transit, walking, and bicycling.

This action supports the following SFMTA Transit First Policy Principles:

- 1. To ensure quality of life and economic health in San Francisco, the primary objective of the transportation system must be the safe and efficient movement of people and goods.
- 2. Public transit, including taxis and vanpools, is an economically and environmentally sound alternative to transportation by individual automobiles. Within San Francisco, travel by public transit, by bicycle and on foot must be an attractive alternative to travel by private automobile.
- 3. Decisions regarding the use of limited public street and sidewalk space shall encourage the use of public rights of way by pedestrians, bicyclists, and public transit, and shall strive to reduce traffic and improve public health and safety.

ITEMS

The following items were considered at Public Hearing on January 17, 2025

- A. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA I (Eligibility only, no signs) 500 block of Valencia Street, east side, between 16th Street and 17th Street except parcel(s) already in RPP (Requested by residents).
 - Modification A would extend RPP Area I to this block facing restricted street parking and allow the residents to purchase parking permits for their vehicle to park within Area I.
- B. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA R (Eligibility only, no signs), 600 block of Van Ness Avenue, both sides, between Golden Gate Avenue and Turk Street (Requested by residents).
 - Modification B would extend RPP Area R to this block facing restricted street parking and allow the residents to purchase parking permits for their vehicle to park within Area R.
- C. RESCIND 2-HOUR PARKING, 7 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, ESTABLISH GENERAL METERED PARKING, NO TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, Bryant Street, north side, from 20 feet to 610 feet west of 7th Street, Bryant Street, south side, from 54 feet to 164 feet west of 7th Street,

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Bryant Street, south side, from Langton Street to 72 feet westerly, Bryant Street, south side, from 117 feet to 390 feet west of Langton Street, Bryant Street, south side, between Kate Street and 8th Street, Bryant Street, north side, between 8th Street and 9th Street, Bryant Street, north and south sides, between 9th Street and 10th Street (Requested by SFMTA).

Modification C would convert 2-Hour time limited parking to General Metered Parking on Bryant Street between 7th Street and 10th Street to promote turnover for businesses and visitors along this commercial corridor, as well as match surrounding regulations in the area.

D. RESCIND – ONE-HOUR PARKING, 8AM-10PM EVERYDAY EXCEPT AREA U PERMITS, ESTABLISH – TOW AWAY NO STOPPING ANY TIME, Langton Street, west side, from Howard Street to 120 feet southerly (Requested by residents).

Modification D would improve safety near the Howard-Langton Community Garden as requested by residents.

- E. RESCIND TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, YELLOW ZONE, COMMERCIAL LOADING, 60- MINUTE TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 3 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, California Street, south side, from 6 feet to 64 feet east of Battery Street California Street, south side, from 105 feet to 146 east of Battery Street (Requested by SFMTA).
- F. RESCIND WHITE ZONE, PASSENGER LOADING, 9 AM TO 3 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, California Street, south side, from 64 feet to 105 feet east of Battery Street (Requested by SFMTA).
- G. RESCIND TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, 7 AM TO 9 AM AND 3 PM TO 6 PM, EXCEPT SATURDAY AND SUNDAY, California Street, south side, from Battery Street to Davis Street (Requested by SFMTA).
- H. RESCIND PART-TIME BUS ZONE, 7 AM TO 10 AM AND 3 PM TO 7 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, California Street, south side, from 90 feet to 224 feet east of Front Street (Requested by SFMTA).
- I. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, YELLOW ZONE, COMMERCIAL LOADING, 60- MINUTE TIME LIMIT, 10 AM TO 3 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, California Street, south side, from 6 feet to 105 feet east of Battery Street (Requested by SFMTA).
- J. ESTABLISH WHITE ZONE, PASSENGER LOADING, 9 AM TO 3 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, California Street, south side, from 105 feet to 146 east of Battery Street (Requested by SFMTA).
- K. ESTABLISH PART-TIME BUS ZONE, 7 AM TO 10 AM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, California Street, south side, from 6 feet to 105 feet east of Battery Street (Requested by SFMTA).

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Modifications E–K would remove the peak-hour tow-away lane, establish a part-time bus zone, and adjust the location of a white zone on the 200 block.

CEQA provides a categorical exemption from environmental review for operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301.

- D. RESCIND ONE-HOUR PARKING, 8AM-10PM EVERYDAY EXCEPT AREA U PERMITS, ESTABLISH TOW AWAY NO STOPPING ANY TIME, Langton Street, west side, from Howard Street to 120 feet southerly.
- E. RESCIND TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, YELLOW ZONE, COMMERCIAL LOADING, 60- MINUTE TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 3 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, California Street, south side, from 6 feet to 64 feet east of Battery Street California Street, south side, from 105 feet to 146 east of Battery Street.
