San Francisco—The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) releases the following upcoming event-related traffic and transit impacts for this weekend, Thursday, September 20 through Wednesday, September 26, 2018. Anyone traveling in San Francisco can check www.sfmta.com or call 311 to find out which of the 83 Muni lines will get them where they want to go. **All road users are encouraged to be aware, share the roadway and to follow all rules to ensure everyone's safety. Whether you are riding Muni, taking a taxi, walking, riding a bike or driving, please remain vigilant to keep everyone safe. If you see suspicious activity, please report it.**

Thursday, September 20: The Eagles will be performing at AT&T Park. The concert will start at 5 p.m. Attendance is expected to be 35,000.

Friday, September 21: The Journey, Def Leppard & Foreigner will be performing at AT&T Park. The concert will start at 6 p.m. Attendance is expected to be 35,000.

During each concert, heavy traffic is expected in and around AT&T Park. Those who choose to drive should allow extra travel time.

A street closure of Terry Francois between 3rd and South streets will be required from 2:30 p.m. until midnight, each day, Thursday, September 20 and Friday, September 21.

Motorists are advised to avoid the increased congestion in downtown San Francisco and to avoid using the Bay Bridge two hours before and after the concert. Use of public transit, taxi, bicycles or walking is recommended.

Muni Service to AT&T Park

The following Muni service will be available to and from the event: **E Embarcadero; T Third; N Judah; Metro Ballpark Shuttles; 10 Townsend; 30 Stockton; 45 Union/Stockton; and 47 Van Ness.**

The SFMTA will provide additional Metro train service to the ballpark.

Options for Buying Muni Tickets

Muni Ticket Sales - In Person

Muni customers may purchase their fare in advance, on-board vehicles and at any Muni ticket vending machine.

Muni customers transferring from BART may purchase round trip Muni transfer tickets at the Embarcadero Station two and a half hours prior to the start time of the concerts.

Transfers will be valid for up to two hours after the end of event.

Use of Clipper® Card

Event participants are encouraged to use Clipper® Card to get to AT&T Park. Customers using Bay Area public transportation systems are strongly encouraged to purchase their fares in advance or use Clipper® Card to attend the event. Customers using a Clipper Card receive 50 cents off an adult single ride when transferring to Muni from BART, Golden Gate Ferry and Transit, and San Francisco Bay Ferry routes (Oakland-Alameda, Harbor Bay and Vallejo). Golden Gate Ferry and Transit and San Francisco Bay Ferry provide the same discount on return trips.

Event participants may use [MuniMobile](#), an official SFMTA app, to save time by instantly buying tickets for Muni bus, rail, cable car, and paratransit services on their iPhone and Android devices. Tickets can be purchased through a credit/debit card or PayPal account for individual or multiple riders on one smartphone. Customers can buy tickets ahead of time and activate when they are ready to ride - with MuniMobile, your phone is your fare.

Purchase Single Ride Muni Fare Electronically

Muni customers who purchase fares in advance using a Clipper® Card or use the official SFMTA app, [MuniMobile](#), can save 25 cents per trip. A single ride fare on Muni is good for two hours of travel, whether it be on a single route or a trip with multiple transfers across buses and light rail.

Dreamforce Convention

Now through Saturday, September 29: A street closure of Howard Street between 3rd and 4th streets is in effect for the Dreamforce Convention until 8 p.m., Saturday, September 29.

Tuesday, September 25 through Friday, September 28: The Salesforce Corporation will be holding its yearly Dreamforce Convention at the Moscone Center. Conference hours will be from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., each day. An attendance of 60,000 is expected to attend workshops and product demonstrations at Moscone Center North, South and West.

Significant traffic congestion is anticipated in and around Moscone Center between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. daily for the duration of the closure. Travelers are encouraged to take public transportation or use alternate routes. There will be heavy pedestrian traffic in the area.

Howard Street traffic will be detoured via southbound 2nd Street to Harrison Street, or via New Montgomery Street to Hawthorne Street to either Folsom or Harrison streets.

There will be signed bicycle detour for people on bikes on Howard Street to turn north at 2nd Street to Market Street. People on bikes who wish to stay on Howard Street will have the option to dismount at Howard and 3rd streets and walk their bicycle through the event along the north sidewalk.

Signage will be placed in advance of the street closures and detour routes.

Caltrans will activate electronic message signs on major freeways entering the city to notify motorists of the closures.

NEW: Bus Shuttles Substitute Powell-Mason Cable Car

Friday, September 21 through Saturday, September 29: To accommodate the Muni Cable Car Gearbox Rehabilitation Project, bus shuttles will substitute the Powell-Mason Line along the northern route from Powell to Washington streets to Taylor Street at Francisco Street. Bus service will begin at 10 p.m., Friday, September 21 until the end of service on Saturday, September 29. Regular cable car service will resume at the start of service on Sunday, September 30.

Throughout the duration of bus substitution for cable car service:

- All other cable car lines will operate as usual.
- Powell-Mason line customers traveling to the northern terminal at Francisco and Bay can ride Powell-Hyde Line and transfer to a bus at Powell and Washington streets to continue the rest of the trip.
- The bus shuttles will follow the Mason Line and pick up passengers at the curb at cable car stops
- The terminal at Francisco and Bay streets will be out of service. There will be a temporary bus stop on Taylor, south of Francisco Street.
- Bus service will be free for customers transferring to or from cable cars.
- Regular fare of \$7 will apply on cable car.

To ensure drivers' safety during the tree removal, a closure of southbound Highway 1 between US101/Presidio Parkway and Lake Street will be required from 11:15 p.m. to 4:45 a.m., each night, from Monday, September 24 to Thursday, September 27. Northbound traffic will not be affected.

During the road closure, traffic will be detoured. Detour signs will be in place.

UPDATE: Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project

Now through January 2020: Crews will begin Phase Two of the Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project.

Since Monday, September 17, 2018, the bridge draw span has been lowered and locked in the down position. For a major part of the 15-month construction duration, the bridge will remain accessible to vehicles, pedestrians and bicyclists. Over the course of the project, there will be some instances where a full short-term bridge closure will be required to gain access to areas underneath the bridge or to safely install scaffolding above the roadway.

Crews have begun setting up a construction yard along the northern half of Terry A. Francois Boulevard. Private vehicle access through Terry A. Francois Boulevard between 3rd Street and the Northeast corner is restricted. Access for emergency vehicles and bicyclists is still available. Pedestrian access along the public right of way/sidewalk on Terry A. Francois Boulevard (i.e. to The Yard) is being maintained.

Traffic disruptions during general rehabilitation work should be expected to be less intrusive than full long-term bridge closures. Motorists are advised to plan and allow additional travel time or use alternate routes during the rehabilitation work to reach their destination. General work hours will be from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

UPDATE: Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project *continued*

During the course of rehabilitation work, access for watercraft traffic under the bridge is limited to kayaks or other vessels that can safely pass below the closed bridge. The bridge will not be raised for the duration of this phase.

Vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic across the bridge is being maintained during the rehabilitation work, except for the instances where a full bridge closure is required. Motorists are advised to be aware that travel lanes may be restricted or altered during different phases of rehabilitation work on the bridge. More information about the phasing and sequencing of the work will be provided as it gets closer to the start of construction.

Construction scheduling is subject to change due to weather delays, equipment problems and/or unforeseen field conditions.

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project

The Van Ness Improvement Project is a civic improvement project that will bring San Francisco's first Bus Rapid Transit system. To maximize the benefits of construction, the City will also be replacing major utilities including water, sewer and emergency firefighting water systems. Work will also be done to repave Van Ness Avenue, enhance streetlights and landscaping, and install new sidewalk lighting and rain gardens.

Traffic lanes on Van Ness Avenue have been shifted to create two construction zones for upcoming utility work. Because some of this work requires reducing Van Ness Avenue to one lane in each direction, some work is limited to nighttime hours.

Friday, September 21, between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.:

- **From Geary to O'Farrell streets:** Crews are scheduled to work on updating the emergency firefighting water system. Disruptive noise is expected.
- **On Grove Street:** Crews are scheduled to work on water main installation.

Neighbors are advised to anticipate construction-related noise as crews work diligently to complete necessary night work.

UPDATE: Construction of Mission Bay Loop

The SFMTA has resumed construction on 18th, 19th and Illinois streets, the project is expected to be completed in late 2018.

The Mission Bay Loop is a key component for San Francisco's T Third rail line and is critical to operating the T Third Central Subway service plan. The loop provides turn-around capabilities for the T Third Street light rail line via a connection of trackway from 3rd Street to 18th, Illinois and 19th streets, which will allow the SFMTA to operate the necessary service levels needed to support current and planned growth within the eastern portion of San Francisco.

Traffic, including travelling by bike, may be affected by the construction work. All work areas will be clearly marked and there will be flaggers to help direct traffic.

In order to conduct the work, parking on both sides including along the historical Crane Cove Park fence (east side of Illinois Street) will be removed 24 hours, 7 days a week from 18th to 19th and Illinois streets for the duration of the project.

Beginning in late September, a partial street closure will go into effect in order to accommodate duct bank work on Illinois Street between 18th and 19th streets for 90 days. Outer traffic lanes traveling both north and south on Illinois Street will remain open for through traffic. Immediately following the duct bank work, the track work will begin.

Local access to properties along the project site will be maintained. Sewer work is scheduled to be completed by summer 2018.

ONGOING: J Church Track Maintenance Project

Since Monday, September 17 and continue for about three weeks, J Church track maintenance work is taking place at the intersection of 23rd and Church streets. During construction, the J Church rail service will operate as normal. Church Street will remain open, eastbound and westbound lanes on 23rd Street may be closed occasionally and traffic approaching the intersection will be detoured.

ONGOING: J Church Track Maintenance Project *continued*

Work hours are from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

During construction hours, 10 parking spaces **are not available** near the job site. Additional six parking spaces have been removed for staging 24 hours a day for the duration of the project.

ONGOING: Central Subway Project

Construction of the 4th and Brannan streets surface station platform is ongoing. Until further notice, traffic reroutes will remain in effect. Street restoration work has tentatively been scheduled to start on September 17 at the intersection of 4th and Brannan streets. This may affect traffic and pedestrian movement at the intersection. The work is scheduled to take place between 9 a.m. and 5 a.m. and may last several days.

Sewer replacement work continues Monday through Friday, from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. at 4th and Howard streets. Two through lanes are in place southbound 4th Street. Westbound traffic on Howard Street may be impacted.

One lane on the south side of Ellis Street is open at all times for eastbound traffic. The parking garage between Ellis and O'Farrell is accessible on the north side of Ellis Street. Street and sidewalk restoration work continues on the north side of the intersection of Ellis and Stockton streets, as well as on O'Farrell east of Stockton.

Washington Street between Stockton Street and Trenton Alley is under a long-term temporary closure to vehicular traffic as station construction continues. Pedestrian access to Washington Street between Stockton Street and Trenton Alley remains open. The pedestrian walkway scaffolding along the west side of Stockton Street south of Washington Street may be disassembled in the coming weeks, Pedestrian access through this area will be temporarily rerouted.

The Central Subway project is the first underground line to link the north and south corridors of the city, and will provide a direct connection to major retail, sporting and cultural venues while efficiently transporting people to jobs, educational opportunities and other amenities throughout San Francisco.

ONGOING: UCSF Mission Bay Arena Platform Project

In anticipation of the new Golden State Warriors' Chase Center and growth in the Mission Bay, the SFMTA is constructing a new center platform along 3rd Street between South and 16th streets. This new, larger platform will service both inbound and outbound trains and greatly expand transit capacity in preparation for large crowds.

Construction work is ongoing, with decommission of the Muni platform planned for mid-November and a new platform anticipated to be completed and in service in early summer of 2019. Bus substitutions will serve the T-Third line during parts of construction.
