#### ACCESSIBLE MEETING POLICY

The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors/Parking Authority Commission meeting will be held in Room 400, at 1 Dr. Carlton B. The meeting room is wheelchair accessible. Accessible curbside parking spaces have been designated on the Van Ness Avenue and McAllister Street perimeters of City Hall for mobility-impaired persons. A. ESTABLISH – TOW-AWAY NO PARKING, PERMITTED COMMUTER SHUTTLE BUS ZONE, 6 AM TO 10 AM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY – Van Ness Avenue, west side, from 29 feet to 118 feet south of Sacramento Street. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution. The proposed action is an Approval Action as defined by S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31.)

(10.4) Amending Transportation Code, Division II, Section 914 to revise the regulatory requirements for the Commuter Shuttle Pilot program to add white zones to the definition of "Designated Stop"; add timely payment of permit fees and penalties as a permit condition; and authorize the SFMTA to establish limited payment plans to extend the deadline for payment of administrative penalties. (Explanatory documents include a staff report, resolution and amendment.)

(10.5) Authorizing the Director to execute the grant agreement with the Bay Area Air Quality Management District for \$70,000 of Transportation Fund for Clean Air funds to install electronic bicycle lockers at up to four parking lots and garages that accommodate 28 bicycles at a time, for a term in excess of 10 years. - F. ESTABLISH PASSENGER LOADING ZONE, 7 AM TO 7 PM, DAILY Mission Bay Boulevard South, south side, from 245 feet to 274 feet east of 4th Street.

Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.
