# PURPOSE

To approve various routine parking and traffic modifications.

## STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS AND TRANSIT FIRST POLICY PRINCIPLES:

This action supports the following SFMTA Strategic Plan Goals:

- 4. Make streets safer for everyone.
- 5. Deliver reliable and equitable transportation services.
- 6. Eliminate pollution and greenhouse gas emissions by increasing use of transit, walking, and bicycling.

This action supports the following SFMTA Transit First Policy Principles:

- 1. To ensure quality of life and economic health in San Francisco, the primary objective of the transportation system must be the safe and efficient movement of people and goods.
- 2. Public transit, including taxis and vanpools, is an economically and environmentally sound alternative to transportation by individual automobiles. Within San Francisco, travel by public transit, by bicycle and on foot must be an attractive alternative to travel by private automobile.
- 3. Decisions regarding the use of limited public street and sidewalk space shall encourage the use of public rights of way by pedestrians, bicyclists, and public transit, and shall strive to reduce traffic and improve public health and safety.

### ITEMS

The following items were considered at Public Hearing on November 5, 2021

A. ESTABLISH - RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA R – 1200 Gough Street (Requested by residents).

Modification A extended RPP Area R eligibility to this building facing a metered street to allow residents to purchase parking permits for their vehicle to park within RPP Area R.

B. ESTABLISH - RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA J – 652 Stanyan Street (Requested by residents).

Modification B extended RPP Area J eligibility to this building facing a metered street to allow residents to purchase parking permits for their vehicle to park within the RPP Area.

C. ESTABLISH - RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING (RPP) AREA S – ESTABLISH - 2-HOUR PARKING, 8 AM TO 9 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT VEHICLES WITH AREA S PERMITS – Dolores Street, east side, between 20th Street and Cumberland Street (Requested by residents).

Modification C extended Area S to allow residents to purchase permits for and park within RPP Area S.

D. ESTABLISH - RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA Y – 222 Beale Street (Requested by residents).

Modification D extended RPP Area Y eligibility to this building facing a restricted parking street to allow residents to purchase parking permits for their vehicle to park within RPP Area Y.

E. ESTABLISH - RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA G – 2300 block of Geary Boulevard between Broderick Street and Baker Street (Requested by residents).

Modification E extended RPP Area G eligibility to this block to allow residents to purchase parking permits for their vehicle to park within the RPP Area G.

# ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW
