

(1) Octavia St @ Patricia's Green 'open street' / trial closure

- General reception (*written comments with an evident position*)
 - Positive (21)
 - Somewhat negative (4)
 - 3 - Concerned about additional traffic on Linden St
 - 3 - Propose local access only at Fell St & Octavia St
 - 1 - Focus on making traffic flow better on Laguna and Buchanan (i.e., more concerned about the impact of Octavia's closure on N/S travel)
 - Negative (1)
 - 1 - Don't do it
- Specific feedback
 - *Public space*
 - Neighborhood needs more people/pedestrian space
 - Need more space specifically for children
 - Expand Linden Living Alley
 - *Bicycling*
 - Consider how to route bicycle traffic through closure
 - Need better guidance at intersection of Hayes St & Octavia St
 - Consider allowing for contra-flow bicycle traffic in alleys
 - *Traffic operations*
 - Right-only at Linden puts too much traffic on Linden St (should be pedestrian priority space) - restrict traffic at Fell St & Octavia St
 - Consider "local access only" at Fell St & Octavia St (residents, deliveries, refuse collection, emergency vehicles only)
 - Consider closing on both sides of the park, Fell to Hayes streets
 - Need to make traffic flow better on adjacent streets (e.g., Laguna St, Buchanan St, Fell & Oak streets)
 - Need speed control on Octavia's local lanes (e.g., speed humps)
 - *Parking*
 - Retain parking - already in short supply
 - Remove parking - reallocate to wider sidewalks / public space
 - *Other*
 - Keep PROXY space - neighborhood needs public space
 - More housing/condos will bring too much shade to the area

(2) Octavia Blvd local lane streetscape design

- Specific feedback
 - *Concept 1: Shared Space*
 - Add more seating (e.g., benches)
 - Add more green space (e.g., trees, plants, grass, flowers)
 - Curb-less surfaces could be an issue for kids (don't know when to stop)
 - Consider how texture/paving could affect bicycling
 - Texture and pavers make for a great walking experience
 - Provide more usable space (for activities)
 - Flexible design
 - Parking — provide more, provide less
 - Likes: 'texture', 'permeable paving', "people-watching supportive space"
 - Dislikes: 'removable bollards'
 - *Concept 2: Urban Playscape*
 - Add more seating (e.g., playful/artful seating)
 - This design provides the most people space / seating
 - Add more green space (e.g., trees, plants, grass, flowers)
 - Use pavers from Patricia's Green in the right-of-way
 - Consider the needs of people with disabilities (e.g., regarding seating)
 - Give careful consideration to the design of art and streetscape elements - that they are attractive and function well
 - Make sure any bollards are strong enough to stop a vehicle
 - Inviting design (promotes community)
 - This design does not require any formal programming
 - People won't want a "playscape" on the side of a busy street
 - Parking — provide more, provide less
 - Consider who will steward/maintain the space
 - Likes: 'art not bollards', 'playful seating', 'urban prototyping', and 'curbless alleys'
 - *Concept 3: Linear Green*
 - Add more seating
 - Consider adding more people/hang-out space
 - Add more green space (e.g., trees, plants, grass, flowers)
 - Consider drought-tolerant plants
 - Trees should not completely block the sunlight
 - Sidewalk / walkable space is lessor in this option than the other two
 - Consider the needs of dogs (e.g., their poop - with trash cans)
 - Consider who will steward/maintain the space
 - Parking — provide more, provide less
 - Likes: 'rain gardens', 'water infiltration', 'integrated seating', 'permeable parking'
 - Dislikes: 'rain gardens' (it doesn't flood)

(3) Market Street & Market/Octavia intersection

- Specific feedback
 - *Market Street*
 - Parking — provide more, provide less
 - *Market/Octavia intersection*
 - Keep left turn from Market onto Octavia [no reasoning provided]
 - More bike boxes to facilitate left turns
 - Filling in the weird bike chute at the NW corner is a very good idea
 - Close the off-ramp off entirely (too much traffic in Hayes Valley)

(4) Miscellaneous traffic operations

- Specific feedback
 - Add a dedicated right turn phase at Hayes St & Gough St (current phase is short and pedestrians crossing allow for only a few cars to turn each cycle)
 - Drivers sometimes make unsafe U-turns to avoid the congestion
 - On Fell St b/w Gough and Franklin streets: add left turn lanes in the middle of the street for turns onto both Gough and Franklin streets, switching mid-block; retain a single thru lane in each direction
 - Need better bicycling routing at Octavia St & Hayes St
 - Put bus traffic on Grove St
 - Install speed humps on the block of Linden St b/w Laguna and Octavia streets
 - Dedicated primary motor thoroughfares in the city (with elevated crossings) and leave the rest of the streets for walking and bicycling
 - Cut-and-cover to bury roads and provide direct connections into the underground parking garages of new residential developments

(5) Patricia's Green / PROXY

- Specific feedback
 - Keep PROXY space - neighborhood needs public space
 - Would like to see more events in Patricia's Green park
 - Manage the "rental of parks"
 - Need an enclosed/protected children playing space
 - Add more playground equipment for kids of all ages
 - Need an enclosed dog space (separate from children play space)
 - Add more shade / sun protection (e.g., trees)
 - Preserve sunlight-accessible spaces
 - Add more tables (for picnicking)
 - Remove the paving/road on both sides of Patricia's Green and expand the park
