

"Geary Blvd Water/Sewer" contract: Masonic to Van Ness

• All work is complete and contractor has demobilized.

"Geary East" contract: Van Ness to Market Street

- All water mains are installed. Service connection work is underway between Taylor and Powell streets.
- Curb ramp and sidewalk bulb-out work on Geary between Leavenworth and Jones streets.
- Potholing for private Verizon conduit work on Geary.






"West Surface" contract: Stanyan to Van Ness

- Work in "Segment A" is finishing up, with only work at Steiner (Hamilton Rec Center) remaining.
- Work in "Segment B" is currently between Webster and Van Ness with last bulb-outs and some repaving remaining.
- Traffic signal switchovers remaining: Gough and Buchanan.
- Potential for delay at Buchanan Street due to tree removal process.

A new traffic signal, crosswalk striping, pedestrian bulbs and streetlights help improve safety for people walking at Geary and Cook

The Geary Rapid Project may be best known for helping to make 38 Geary trips well, more rapid. But, along with improving transit performance and reliability along a three-mile stretch of Geary, an equally important feature of the project is to make the streets safer.

Geary is part of the high-injury network, and people walking there are eight times more likely to be involved in a serious or deadly collision than the average San Francisco street. Highway-like conditions on Geary Boulevard in the Western Addition make for challenging crossings. And the Tenderloin to the east, with its high concentration of children, seniors and people with disabilities, is uniquely vulnerable

- Fall 2021 to early 2022: Additional outreach and potential board legislation of any additional scope




Geary TETL scope
