Patrick Wall stated that he works for Bird and hopes that Bird can be a tool to help SFMTA achieve their climate goals. Bird can be productive in reducing emission numbers.

Bob Walsh stated that Scoot was formed out of concern for the environment, traffic congestion and equity issues. Part of the strategy to reduce emissions is shared vehicles, raising awareness and taking advantage of available curb space. One Scoot can take six or seven trips a day rather than

one vehicle per person. Electric modes work and the SFMTA should encourage electric mobility by offering free parking or reserved parking spots.
