ORDER OF BUSINESS

1. Call to Order

Chairman Brinkman called the meeting to order at 1:04 p.m.

3. Announcement of prohibition of sound producing devices during the meeting.

Chairman Brinkman announced that the ringing of and use of cell phones, pagers and similar sound-producing electronic devices are prohibited at the meeting. She advised that any person responsible for the ringing or use of a cell phone, pager, or other similar sound-producing electronic devices might be removed from the meeting. She also advised that cell phones that are set on "vibrate" cause microphone interference and requested that they be placed in the "off" position.

4. Approval of Minutes

6. Introduction of New or Unfinished Business by Board Members

Chairman Brinkman asked about providing parking for motorcycles and scooters at the 22nd St. Caltrain station and inquired about the cap on dockless bike share vehicles.

Sonali Bose, Director, Finance and Information Technology and Fred Schouten, Manager, Revenue recognized Nancy Marquez, Fare Collection Receiver, Finance and Information Technology.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Ed Reiskin, Director of Transportation, discussed two hit and run fatalities, the Twin Peaks Tunnel project, Muni service, fare changes, and a new mapping technology.

Vice Chairman Heinicke spoke about the fatality in the Twin Peaks Tunnel. When the project is complete, he would like staff to figure out how to honor the worker who was killed. He also asked staff to discuss how the SFMTA anticipate impacts of a project on the entire system more broadly in the staff reports. He asked staff to return to the Board with a timeline for when the agency can implement shuttle service crossing over at West Portal.

Director Torres suggested that a management audit may be in order.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Aleta Dupree stated that she used the shuttles on Sunday. They were fine. She is looking forward to the tunnel reopening and the new fare schedule. The extra time for transfers and the new day pass price will come in handy. She hopes that the extra time will be figured into the Clipper card and the MuniMobile app. Staff has to stay on top of congestion so passengers aren't left waiting.

Herbert Weiner wondered about the Twin Peaks Tunnel contractor and whether the contract was a no bid contract. The contractor was not thoroughly vetted. The Board and the Director bear the responsibility for that. Bus service has been horrid. He wondered if more buses could have been allocated to the Twin Peaks Tunnel project. The L Taraval has the same rotten service as before. The Board doesn't listen to the public and rubberstamps projects. The Board has to be more sensitive.

Charles Minster expressed appreciation to the union members who keep the system running. There was a needless death because the Board and the contractor didn't abide by safety rules. The contractor has a horrid safety record and the Board just took them at their word. These corporations run the City at the behest of the politicians.

Nice LaRosa questioned the SFMTA's commitment to accessibility. In the South of Market, there are many bus shelters that take over sidewalks and boarding islands. He wondered what was being done to ensure that strollers and wheelchairs aren't being blocked from using city sidewalks.

Steven Summerstand discussed the opening of the Transbay Terminal. The maps at the Transbay Terminal are not modern and aren't technological. He is appalled that the effort to build the station left out consideration of the needs of riders and tourists.

8. Citizens' Advisory Council Report

On behalf of Chairman Weaver, Neil Ballard, Chairman, Finance and Administration Committee, reviewed recent recommendations including the Geary Bus Rapid Transit project and raising fees for private shuttles. He commended the operators and wondered if the SFMTA was wanting to grow its' ridership or incentivize the use of private companies. The answer to that is not clear. It would be good if the leadership would address that.

9. Public Comment

Aleta Dupree discussed Muni fares and shared scooters. It's important to have a good contractor for scooters. There are safety issues with cash stands. Equity will help people get into technology. It's important to get the scooter program running.

James Moore discussed the scooter share program. The application process has been clear. The past acts of scooter providers was a clear request. Those acts should be taken into consideration.

Cathy DeLuca expressed concern over delays to safety improvements on Mission Street in the Excelsior. A member of the public was killed while walking in a crosswalk. There was a clear outcry for improvements in 2016. The project has been delayed since then. When safety projects get delayed, people die. Last year, two people were killed, and 20 people have been injured since that time. She urged the Board to move the project forward.

Rachel Hyden stated that voters wanted the SFMTA to build "transit first" friendly streets. She expressed dismay that the circle at McAllister and Steiner is being removed. A traffic light should be implemented. The Transit Riders Union does not want to see any more delays or compromises to safety improvements and transit only lanes.

Maelig expressed appreciation for the removal of the traffic circle. He congratulated staff for the work on many projects including the Twin Peaks Tunnel, the bike share program, the operator shortage and Embarcadero bike lanes. There was a 27-minute service gap this morning.

Charles Minster stated that Muni is owned by the residents of San Francisco, but it's operated by the corporations which drive every decision made, including the Van Ness project, Geary and the Central Subway. Transportation Network Companies (TNCs) are taking over the City and are clogging the streets. There are more accidents. It's long past time for the operators of the systems and residents run the Board and not take orders from downtown.

Tariq Mehmood expressed appreciation for the Taxi Driver Fund. The distribution of funds took care of a lot of bad things. The Taxi Director has called for a Town Hall meeting but no information has been provided about what this meeting is about. He asked for an idea so people can come prepared for the discussion. There have been some great changes and some bad changes to city streets. The Mayor's letter about Ed Reiskin is 100% wrong.
