The Sustainable Streets Division of the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency will hold a public hearing on Friday, October 19, 2018, at 10:00 AM, in Room 416 (Hearing Room 4), City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, San Francisco, CA 94102, to consider the following proposals:

1. <u>Drummond Alley, between Quint Street and Dunshee Street – No Parking Anytime</u> ESTABLISH – NO PARKING ANYTIME

Drummond Alley, between Quint Street and Dunshee Street (Unit Block) (Supervisor District 10) Elizabeth Chen, Elizabeth.chen@sfmta.com

Proposal provides access to garages at the request of a local resident.

2. <u>Jerrold Avenue</u>, <u>between Rankin Street and Toland Street – Speed Cushions</u> ESTABLISH – SPEED CUSHIONS

Jerrold Avenue, eastbound and westbound, from Rankin Street to Toland Street (9 speed cushions) ♦ (Supervisor District 10) Philip Louie, philip.louie@sfmta.com

3. 3839 and 3839A 24th Street – Residential Permit Parking Eligibility ESTABLISH – RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT ELIGIBILITY AREA Z

4. 400-449 Judah Street – Residential Permit Parking Eligibility ESTABLISH – RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT ELIGIBILITY AREA J

400-449 Judah Street (no signs to be installed) (Supervisor District 5) Gerry Porras, Gerry.porras@sfmta.com

5(a). <u>Sacramento Street and Octavia Street – STOP Sign, Bus Zone Relocation</u> ESTABLISH – STOP SIGN

Sacramento Street, eastbound and westbound, at Octavia Street, making this an all-way STOP

5(b). ESTABLISH - BUS ZONE

Sacramento Street, north side, from Octavia Street to 100 feet easterly (removes 4 RPP parking spaces)

Sacramento Street, south side, from Octavia Street to 94 feet westerly (removes 2 RPP parking spaces)

5(c). RESCIND - BUS ZONE

Sacramento Street at Octavia Street, north side, between the eastern and western crosswalks

Sacramento Street, south side, from Octavia Street to 55 feet easterly (restores 2 RPP parking spaces)



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5(d). ESTABLISH - RED ZONE

Sacramento Street, north side, from westerly crosswalk to easterly crosswalk (40-red zone) (Supervisor District 2) Kevin Shue, Kevin.shue@sfmta.com

Categorically exempt from Environmental Review: CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 Class 1(c): Operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities.

8. <u>Bernal Heights Boulevard, between Chapman Street and Powhattan Avenue – No</u> Parking Anytime

ESTABLISH - NO PARKING ANYTIME

Bernal Heights Boulevard, north side, from Chapman Street to 90 feet westerly (for 2 foot sidewalk widening on south side of Bernal Heights Boulevard) (Supervisor District 9) Norman Wong, norman.wong@sfmta.com



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• Items denoted with an asterisk (*) can be given approval by the City Traffic Engineer after the public hearing. Otherwise, the SFMTA Board will make the final approval at a later date based on the outcome at the public hearing.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.
