Often, the best option for improving parking availability in residential areas is Residential Permit Parking (RPP). One of the questions in this survey asks about whether or not you would like RPP in your neighborhood.

The RPP program improves residents' access to on-street parking near their home by limiting parking for non-residents or those without a permit to two hours or less. Residents with permits are exempt from time limits. In newly established RPP Areas, residents are limited to one permit per driver and two permits per household. Households with more than two drivers may petition the SFMTA for up to two additional permits. There are also permits for in-home medical and child care providers. Commercial vehicles with a gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) of less than 6,000 pounds are eligible for permits.

The current annual RPP permit fee is \$136. For more information about RPP, please go to our website at www.sfmta.com/rpp.
