- Follow up meeting to be held with SF Fire Department




#### 7. Geary Boulevard Improvement Project update

Update on 35% design plans:

- Preliminary layouts were shared with various departments for their review to ensure guidelines and requirements are met (such as ADA accessibility).
- Received comments from other design units. Reviewing feedback to incorporate into the layouts.



#### **Overview**





#### Water and Sewer: Masonic to Van Ness

- SFPUC Contract (JMB Construction)
- Work commenced in February 2019
- First work areas
  - Early February/March: Weekend sewer upgrades on Geary eastbound between Presidio Ave to Lyon Street (photos below)
  - Late February/March: Weekday water upgrades on Geary eastbound between St. Joseph's Ave and Scott Street







#### Van Ness to Market Street Contract ("East")

- Advertised by SF Public Works on 2/15/2019
- Engineer's estimate: \$6.4 million
  - \$2.8 million for SFMTA scope, primarily pedestrian bulbs, O'Farrell/Leavenworth signal upgrade, and 2 transit bulb extensions
  - \$3.5 million for significant SFPUC water main work along Geary
- Estimated duration from Notice to Proceed to Substantial Completion: 783 calendar days
- Bid opening: 3/20/2019



#### **California Pacific Medical Center - Coordinated Work**

- Repaving on Geary between Franklin and Van Ness
- Followed by re-striping, which includes removal of peak tow-away lane (becomes full-time parking lane)





#### Changes in response to stakeholder comments

- On Boswell and on Fillmore at Geary
  - Conversion of regular metered spaces to green metered spaced to improve turnover for businesses where adjacent parking was removed as a part of near-term implementation.

#### On Broderick at Geary

- Conversion of general parking into motorcycle parking to replace motorcycle parking that was eliminated as a part of near-term implementation.
- Both have gone through public hearings and implementation will be in coming months.



#### Upcoming signal phasing changes at Geary/Laguna

In order to improve safety for people crossing at Geary/Laguna, SFMTA will implement signal phasing changes at this intersection in early April including:

- Northbound and southbound vehicle movements will be separated to reduce potential conflicts to allow greater focus on pedestrians
- Increase the amount of time for people walking to cross the street

SFMTA will conduct outreach to nearby stakeholders in late March/early April including:

- Signage posted at the intersection for both vehicles and pedestrians
- Emails/phone calls to nearby neighborhood stakeholders

#### 10. Geary Rapid – Business Construction Mitigation Plan

- Corridor-specific marketing campaigns focused on four merchant-dense neighborhoods:
  - Fillmore, Japantown, Tenderloin, Union Square
  - Two meetings per neighborhood, with a marketing package to be determined by each merchant group
- As-needed wayfinding signage at intersections
- As-needed "Open for Business" banners for individual businesses
- Liaison from Office of Economic and Workforce Development to provide business support services (e.g. business loans)
