The northbound 24 Divisadero line patrons often have to board in the street because of this. He stated he has not heard one positive comment regarding the seating on the new Siemens light rail vehicles. A change order should be considered.

Paul Rose, Chief Spokesperson & Media Relations Manager discussed social media goals, digital communication efforts, and the service alert process of the SFMTA.

Edward Mason inquired about the connection between the SFMTA and 511. He stated that there needs to be scripts written for people to make announcements. He wondered if it is appropriate for announcements for police to respond to a certain station to be heard system wide.

8. Presentation, discussion, and possible action regarding the 55 Dogpatch. (Erin McMillan, Public Information Officer. Explanatory documents include a slide presentation.)

Craig Raphael, Project manager, stated that the 55 Dogpatch Project is a new extension of the 55 line that will replace the 22 Fillmore routing south of 16th Street, which is being shifted to serve Mission Bay in early 2020. He discussed the final routing, parking changes for bus stops and turns, and next steps.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Edward Mason stated that he was glad to see the preservation of the 33 line. He inquired if the 22 Fillmore line will be off-wire when it is re-routed. He also asked what the plans are for Pier 70 residents and if there are any plans between the city and the planning department to provide shuttles for those residents.
