Customers using Bay Area public transportation systems are strongly encouraged to purchase their fares in advance or use Clipper® Card to attend the event. Customers using a Clipper Card receive 50 cents off an adult single ride when transferring to Muni from BART, Golden Gate Ferry and Transit, and San Francisco Bay Ferry routes (Oakland-Alameda, Harbor Bay and Vallejo). Customers can buy tickets ahead of time and activate when they are ready to ride - with MuniMobile, your phone is your fare.

Single Ride Muni Fare

A single ride fare on Muni is good for two hours of travel, whether it be on a single route or a trip with multiple transfers across buses and light rail. Customers who purchase their fares in advance using a Clipper® Card or to use the official SFMTA app, [MuniMobile](#), can save 25 cents per trip. All Muni service will be provided at the regular fare:

- \$2.75 for adults (age 19-64)
- \$1.35 for seniors (ages 65 and older) and youth (5-18)
- \$1.35 for people with disabilities
- All single ride fares paid for by cash or Clipper Card will receive the regular two-hour transfer

To expedite boarding on Muni vehicles and to receive single-ride discount, customers are encouraged to use their Clipper cards or to purchase ticket by using MuniMobile App. Proof-of-payment will be in effect on all Muni service.

Muni Providing Extra Metro Service to the San Francisco Pride Parade

Sunday, June 30: The annual San Francisco Pride Parade will begin at 10:30 a.m. from the lower Market Street formation area. The parade will commence at Market and Beale streets and proceed west on Market Street to Hyde and 8th streets, where it will disband on 8th Street.

At 9 a.m. Market Street from Steuart Street to Van Ness Avenue will be closed for the parade. All intersections will be closed to cross traffic during the parade, which is scheduled to end at approximately 5 p.m. As each section of Market Street is cleaned by the San Francisco Public Works personnel, it will be reopened.

The following streets comprise the formation area will be closed beginning at 6 a.m. Traffic on cross streets will be allowed to continue, subject to delays, except when parade units are actually crossing the intersections:

- Beale Street from Market to Folsom streets
- Main Street from Market to Folsom streets
- Spear Street from Market to Folsom streets
- Steuart Street from Market to Folsom streets
- Market Street from Beale to Steuart streets

Muni lines that normally operate on Market Street will be rerouted to Mission Street.

Mission Street between The Embarcadero and Van Ness Avenue will be posted as "Tow Away/No Parking" and will be restricted to transit, taxis and bicycles only. Both Van Ness Avenue and The Embarcadero will be open for through traffic.

Fourth of July Muni Service, Parking Will Be Enforced

Annual July 4 Independence Day Fireworks Celebration

Next Thursday, July 4: The July 4 annual Independence Day Fireworks Celebration will start at 2 p.m. along the waterfront near the Municipal Pier and Pier 39. Entertainment will be at Pier 39, Aquatic Park and Ghirardelli Square. The fireworks display will begin at 9:30 p.m. **Muni will operate on a [Sunday schedule](#), but [extra Muni service](#) will be provided to and from the fireworks display on The Embarcadero.** The 76X Marin Headlands Express Muni bus will be in service.

Starting from around noon to 11 p.m., large crowds and heavy traffic should be expected to and from Treasure Island.

At approximately 8:30 p.m., no traffic will be allowed north of Lombard Street, from Van Ness to Doyle Drive, except for residents.

As many as 200,000 people are expected in the event area. Traffic congestion and disruption of transit service are expected in the northern section of the city. To ensure safety of the riding public, customers should pay attention to their surroundings and allow extra travel time to get around the City.

Pre-Event Service

Starting at 2 p.m. until 8:30 p.m., Muni will provide extra service to connect people from Muni Metro Subway, BART, Ferries and Caltrain to both viewing area along The Embarcadero, **from Caltrain Station to the Pier 39.**

Post-Event Service

Return express shuttle service will begin after the fireworks display at around 9 p.m. until 11:30 p.m. Shuttles will board at two locations:

- Kearny and North Point streets for service to the Ferry Building and Caltrain station
- Van Ness and Bay streets for service to Civic Center Muni/BART Station

Once the crowds disperse, regular Muni service will resume. This can take at least a half hour. Participants and those traveling in the area are asked to allow extra travel time.

Purchasing Muni Fare [Note: New Muni Fare effective July 1]

Between 2:30 and 8:30 p.m., SFMTA staff will be selling transfers at the Ferry Building, inbound F Market & Wharves platform. Muni customers are encouraged to purchase their round-trip fare in advance or use a Clipper® Card. Regular Muni fares apply:

- \$3 for adults (age 19-64) or \$6 for a round trip fare
- \$1.50 for seniors (ages 65 and older), youth (5-18) or \$3 for a round trip fare
- \$1.50 for people with disabilities or \$3 for a round trip fare
- All single ride fares paid for by cash or Clipper Card will receive the regular 2-hour transfer

Muni Reroutes

The following regular Muni lines and routes will be re-routed due to congestion in the event area: **E Embarcadero***; **F Market & Wharves****; **8 Bayshore Express**; **19 Polk**; **28 19th Avenue**; **30 Stockton**; **39 Coit**; **47 Van Ness** and **49 Van Ness-Mission.**

* **The E Embarcadero line** will only operate as streetcars until 2 p.m. After 2 p.m. bus shuttles will operate along The Embarcadero to 4th and King/Townsend Streets on Thursday, July 4.

** **The F Market & Wharves line** will operate on regular Muni buses all day on Thursday, July 4.

Parking

CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES

UPDATE: Muni Track Work at Judah Street & 17th Avenue

Since Monday, June 24, for about four weeks, N Judah track maintenance work has been taking place at Judah Street and 17th Avenue. During construction, the N Judah rail service is operating without interruption. While Judah Street remains open, vehicular traffic along 17th Avenue is temporarily for "right turn only" until work completed.

Work hours are from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Saturday. During construction:

- While measures are being taken to minimize inconvenience, neighbors can expect some noise during demolition.
- To accommodate the construction, four parking spaces, two on each side of 17th Avenue north of the intersection, are being used as staging areas. They are unavailable for parking 24 hours a day for the duration. Additionally three or four parking spaces on the remaining sides of the street are unavailable during construction work hours.
- Crosswalks and sidewalks may be occasionally closed.
- Due to lane closures, slow traffic is expected. All travelers, especially drivers, are encouraged to leave extra time and move carefully through the area.

Because some work requires reducing Van Ness Avenue to one lane in each direction, some work is limited to nighttime hours. UPDATE: Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project

Third Street Bridge rehabilitation activity **started since Monday, June 24.** Crews began working a second shift at night after general work hours. Construction work is taking place between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. Night work is anticipated to continue nightly, Monday through Saturday, **through 7 a.m., Friday October 4.**

Crews will transition into phase two of rehabilitation activity on Sunday, June 30. Transition into phase two involves travel lane shifts and other adjustments to the roadway and work area. Vehicle and bicycle access via travel lanes across the bridge continue to be available in each direction, northbound and southbound (**except during periods of full temporary bridge closures when the pending scope of work restricts access across the bridge for all vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic**). Pedestrian access are available via the sidewalk along the eastern side of the bridge. Bicycles may also choose to walk their bicycle along the pedestrian sidewalk as an alternative to riding across the bridge via the travel lane. Pedestrian access via the sidewalk along the western side of the bridge may be unavailable during different phases of upcoming work.

UPDATE: Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project *continued*

Upcoming Road Closures

To facilitate ongoing rehabilitation activity, a temporary full closure of the bridge will soon be implemented. All vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic will be restricted. Full temporary bridge closures are only anticipated to be in effect between the following dates:

- Monday, July 8 to Wednesday, July 17
- Thursday, July 25 to Friday, August 2
- Thursday, August 15 to Friday, August 23, 2019

Construction scheduling is subject to change due to rain or other weather delays, equipment breakdown, and/or unforeseen field conditions. Additional periods of short closures may be possible in September and October 2019, if necessary, to complete remaining rehabilitation work. Information will be shared closer to that period should additional closures seem necessary and details are finalized. Updates will be posted to the project webpage.

ONGOING: UCSF Mission Bay Arena Platform Project

In anticipation of the new Golden State Warriors' arena, the SFMTA is constructing a new 320-foot center platform along 3rd Street between South and 16th streets. The existing platform has been demolished. The new track alignment will include one single and one double crossover to facilitate the movement of vehicles as operations requires. Other associated work includes modification of the overhead contact system, and both above and below ground utility relocation work. Construction will require different phases of work that will necessitate separate transit service plans. For more information visit www.SFMTA.com/MissionBayPlatform.

Work will continue on the platform and surrounding streets through June, with some street closures anticipated in the coming weeks to allow for road repaving.

ONGOING: Construction of Mission Bay Loop

The SFMTA has resumed construction on 18th, 19th and Illinois streets, the project is expected to be completed in summer 2019. Traffic, including travelling by bike, may be affected by the construction work. All work areas will be clearly marked and there will be flaggers to help direct traffic. In order to conduct the work, parking on both sides including along the historical Crane Cove Park fence (east side of Illinois Street) will be removed 24 hours, 7 days a week from 18th to 19th and Illinois streets for the duration of the project.

A partial street closure is currently in effect in order to accommodate duct bank work on Illinois Street between 18th and 19th streets through summer of 2019. Outer traffic lanes traveling both north and south on Illinois Street will remain open for through traffic. Immediately following the duct bank work, the track work will begin.
