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ORDER OF BUSINESS

1. Call to Order

Vice Chair Borden called the meeting to order at 1:06 p.m.

2. Roll Call

- 3. Announcement of prohibition of sound producing devices during the meeting.

Board Secretary Boomer announced that the ringing of and use of cell phones, pagers and similar soundproducing electronic devices are prohibited at the meeting. She advised that any person responsible for the ringing or use of a cell phone, pager, or other similar sound-producing electronic devices might be removed from the meeting. She also advised that cell phones that are set on "vibrate" cause microphone interference and requested that they be placed in the "off" position.

4. Approval of Minutes

No public comment.

On motion to approve the minutes of the September 3, 2019 Regular Meeting: unanimously approved (Heinicke, Torres - absent).

6. Introduction of New or Unfinished Business by Board Members

-Update on the search for the Director of Transportation

Director Eaken provided an update on the search. The Search committee received significant input from employees and stakeholders. She summarized top areas of focus for employees and stakeholders. Interview questions and the job description came directly from this feedback.

No public comment.

7. Director's Report (For discussion only)

-Update on future service improvements -Ongoing Activities

Tom Maguire, interim Director of Transportation, discussed transit service for the Chase Center events: introduced Kimberly Ackerman, new director of Human Resources; funding for overhaul of New Flyer vehicles; Vision Zero street improvements including signal timing changes, and red-light cameras; the Inner Sunset Streetscape Improvement Project and recognition for the 27-Bryant project.

Ms. Ackerman expressed appreciation for the welcome she received.

Julie Kirschbaum, director, Transit discussed upcoming service improvements including schedule changes.

Director Heminger requested a briefing about the expansion of rapid bus service.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Herbert Weiner stated that the elephant in the room is the addition of more buses to the fleet. The SFMTA Has retired buses so the net addition is lower, if there's been any addition at all. The SFMTA is reallocating resources but the population and density of San Francisco is growing. The fleet should be increased to meet these factors. Progress has been glacial in this agency. He would like to see a report on the task force as he doesn't know when they meet.

Christopher Pederson discussed the impact of the opening of the Chase Center on transit service. There should be a look at the ripple effects of the opening on transit. On Friday, he waited for over an hour. Not a single train was running towards Balboa Park. There was a cluster of trains on Third Street going the other direction.

Cat Carter expressed support for the service changes. She appreciates the honesty and transparency, which seems to be shifting agency wide.

Roan Kattouw discussed the opening of the Chase Center and signage. The temporary signage was good. The regular signage is terrible. The bike lane that was implemented as part of the Chase Center is great, but the separation is not good and it's not clear. Out of town drivers don't know what to do.

8. Citizens' Advisory Council Report

9. Public Comment

Frank Reig discussed Revel, the largest moped operator in the United States. They would love to bring their electric moped program to San Francisco. An electric moped is a motor vehicle. They can fit seamlessly into a city. There is no regulatory grey area and there's a ton of accountability. Revel doesn't use the GIG economy model.

John Paar stated that the N Line is unsafe at any speed. Passengers have been sent into the open street to face death every day for nearly 100 years. There are no safe platforms on the street corner. Safety for his community has been ignored. He asked the Board to allocated money to build a safe platform as it did for the Warriors. He also requested a low-level improvement project.

Scott Ellis introduced himself as a Siemens representative.

Herbert Weiner discussed a problem with the 27 bus. He arrived at the stop, but the arrival time kept changing. The 27 isn't a success. There aren't enough buses on that run. It runs lousy which inconvenienced a lot of people.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Jason Chommanard discussed the need for construction mitigation measures for the Central Subway project. Low-income Chinatown businesses need to stay in business during construction. He would like to see shuttle buses and a public outreach campaign.

Roan Kattouw stated the Board is Supervisors did approve a best-value contract award.

14. Presentation and discussion regarding the development of a regional transportation funding measure called FASTER Bay Area. (Explanatory documents include slide presentations.)

Monique Webster, Regional Government Affairs Manager, Nick Josefowitz, Director of Policy, SPUR, Kelly Fallon, Policy Manager, Bay Area Council, presented the item.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Roan Kattouw stated that a group has been working on vision and principles for a regional transportation measure. They have several concerns about FASTER. The groups behind the proposal are not public agencies. They are business groups. He expressed concern about a sales tax measure and stated that it would be good to explore other taxation measures.

Bob Allen stated that a regional transportation measure means that everyone will need to get on board. He is concerned about the process and about regressive revenue sources rather than progressive sources. There has been no discussion about other potential revenue sources. Board members at other transit properties have expressed concern about losing the local ability to use a sales tax measure.

Edward Mason wondered if FASTER Bay Area would remove the commuter shuttles that are operating on 24th Street in San Francisco. The Silicon Valley Leadership group supported VTA which has one of the worst systems in the nation. They support the use of private commuter buses. Employers should pay a higher amount. If the business infrastructure weren't in place, there wouldn't be a problem.

Peter Straus stated that FASTER is an organization as is Voices for Public Transportation. Everyone needs to come together if this is going to get anywhere. It needs to be transformational in terms of revenue sources. He doesn't believe a sales tax measure will win. There has been criticism by the legislature. He suggested following what Seattle did. Support for operations is critical. Any measure needs to provide resources not just for new toys but for existing service.

Thea Selby stated that she's part of Voices for Public Transportation. There are different voices, one from the transit agency in San Jose that is interested that BART gets built and then there's the voice of the rider. They are interested in more service on VTA buses. San Francisco is very rider centric. She hopes riders' voices get heard. A values-based way of working will make this a winnable measure.
