ACCESSIBLE MEETING POLICY

The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors/Parking Authority Commission meeting will be held in Room 400, at 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place (400 Van Ness Ave.), San Francisco, CA. The closest accessible BART station is the Civic Center Station at United Nations Plaza and Market Street. Accessible Muni transit serving this location are: Muni Metro lines J-Church, K-Ingleside, L Taraval, M Ocean View, N Judah and T Third at Van Ness and Civic Center Stations; F Market-Wharves; 19 Polk, 47 Van Ness; 49 Mission-Van Ness; 5 Fulton; 5R Fulton; 6 Haight-Parnassus, 7 Haight-Noriega 7R Haight-Noriega; 21-Hayes; 9 San Bruno; 9R San Bruno Rapid and 71 Haight-Noriega. The meeting room is wheelchair accessible. Accessible curbside parking spaces have been designated on the Van Ness Avenue and McAllister Street perimeters of City Hall for people with mobility impairments. CONSENT CALENDAR

All matters listed hereunder constitute a Consent Calendar, are considered to be routine by the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors and will be acted upon by a single vote. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a member of the Board of Directors or the public so requests, in which event the matter shall be removed from the Consent Calendar and considered as a separate item.
- (10.1) Approving the following traffic modifications:

- A. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA X 1601-1695 18th Street.
- B. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANYTIME Masonic Avenue, west side, from Geary Boulevard to 155 feet northerly.
- C. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING EXCEPT PERMITTED CAR SHARE VEHICLES Golden Gate Ave, north side, from 40 to 80 feet west of Polk Street; Brighton Avenue, west side, from 20 feet to 40 feet south of Ocean Avenue.
- D. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANYTIME ESTABLISH SIDEWALK EXTENSION; Tennessee Street, east side, from 19th Street to 128 feet northerly.
- E. ESTABLISH PASSENGER LOADING ZONE, AT ALL TIMES Tennessee Street, east side, from 128 to 150 feet north of 19th Street.
- F. ESTABLISH RED ZONE ESTABLISH SIDEWALK EXTENSION (6 FEET); 19th Street, north side, from Tennessee Street to 23 feet easterly.
- G. ESTABLISH SPEED TABLES 17th Street, between Market Street and Diamond Street.
- H. ESTABLISH CROSSWALK 17th Street, midblock between Diamond Street and Castro Street.
- I. ESTABLISH CLASS IV BIKEWAY 17th Street, westbound, from Castro Street to 200 feet westerly; and making environmental review findings. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution. For every parking and traffic modification that received a categorical exemption, the proposed action is the Approval Action as defined by Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code.)
- (10.2) Amending the Transportation Code, Division II, Section 801 to expand existing parking restrictions on Turk Street except for vehicles displaying an SFMTA issued permit; and approving parking restrictions to expand existing parking restrictions on Turk Street except for vehicles displaying an SFMTA issued permit as follows:
 - A. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANYTIME EXCEPT VEHICLES DISPLAYING A PERMIT ISSUED BY THE SFMTA, 6 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY Turk Street, north side, from 411 feet to 211 feet west of Gough Street and Turk Street, south side, from 369 feet to 169 feet west of Gough Street.
 - B. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANYTIME EXCEPT VEHICLES DISPLAYING A PERMIT ISSUED BY THE SFMTA, AT ALL TIMES, Turk Street, north and south side, from Laguna Street to 435 feet east. (Explanatory documents include a staff report, amendment and resolution. The proposed action is the Approval Action as defined by Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code.)
- (10.3) Authorizing the Director to execute Modification No. 5 to Contract No. 1236R, Third Street Light Rail Project Mission Bay Loop, with Mitchell Engineering, to perform additional miscellaneous work, increasing the Contract amount by \$492,689.18, for a total Contract amount not to exceed \$7,712,858.98 and making environmental review findings. (Explanatory documents include a staff report, modification, financial plan, environmental review documents and resolution.)

(10.4) Establishing a meeting schedule for 2020 for meetings of the SFMTA Board of Directors/Parking Authority Commission and the Policy and Governance Committee. (Explanatory documents include a staff report, and resolution.)

 - A. ESTABLISH RIGHT OR LEFT TURNS ONLY, EXCEPT BICYCLES Page Street, eastbound, at Webster Street

 - C. ESTABLISH NO LEFT TURN Webster Street, southbound, at Haight Street
 - D. ESTABLISH ONE-WAY STREET, EXCEPT BICYCLES Page Street, westbound, from Octavia Boulevard to Laguna Street
 - E. RESCIND CLASS II BIKEWAY (BIKE LANE) Page Street, eastbound, from Buchanan Street to Octavia Boulevard
 - F. ESTABLISH CLASS II BIKEWAY (BIKE LANE) Page Street, westbound, from Octavia Boulevard to Webster Street
 - G. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANY TIME Page Street, south side, between Laguna Street and Octavia Boulevard
 - H. ESTABLISH CLASS IV BIKEWAY (PROTECTED BIKEWAY) Page Street, eastbound, from Laguna Street to Octavia Boulevard
 - I. ESTABLISH CLASS III BIKEWAY (SHARED LANE) Page Street, eastbound, from Buchanan Street to Laguna Street
 - J. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, MONDAY TO FRIDAY, 7 AM 10 AM AND 3 PM 6 PM Haight Street, south side, from 154 feet west of Buchanan Street to Webster Street
 - K. RESCIND 2-HOUR PARKING, 8 AM TO 9 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT VEHICLES WITH AREA S PERMITS Haight Street, south side, from 154 feet west of Buchanan Street to Webster Street
 - L. ESTABLISH 2-HOUR PARKING, 10 AM TO 3 PM AND 6 PM TO 9 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT VEHICLES WITH AREA S PERMITS Haight Street, south side, from 154 feet west of Buchanan Street to Webster Street. (Explanatory documents include a staff report, environmental review document, drawings and resolution. The proposed action is the Approval Action as defined by Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code.)
- 12. Authorizing the Director to execute Contract Modification No. 6 to Contract No. 2013-19: Procurement of New Light Rail Vehicles, with Siemens Mobility, Inc., to enhance the vehicle design with passenger comforts, updated operator cab features, and engineering refinements that improve fleet performance; and to advance Phase 2 long-lead activities to accelerate fleet replacement, for an amount not to exceed \$9,799,688, with no increase in the total Contract price, and no increase in the term.

Appointing Jeffrey Paul Tumlin to the position of Director of Transportation of the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency, effective December 16, 2019; and approving the execution of an Employment Agreement including a term of ending December 31, 2024, base annual compensation in the amount of \$342,483, benefits equivalent to specified benefits provided to members of the Executive Management bargaining unit under the 2019-2022 Memorandum of Understanding between the Municipal Executives Association and the SFMTA, and one year severance pay. <u>California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31</u>: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically

within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

<u>Board of Supervisors review of certain SFMTA Decisions</u>: Certain parking and traffic modifications as well as Private Transportation Programs that involve certain parking modifications can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors. These decisions are subject to review within 30 calendar days after they are made by the SFMTA Board of Directors.
