The meeting was called to order by Chair Borden at 3:32pm.

3. Presentation, discussion and possible action regarding the job description including minimum qualifications. (Explanatory documents include a report.)

Derek Kim, Chief of Staff, Human Resources, presented the job description.

Chair Borden requested a substitution of years of experience for education and that manager experience be listed as preferred but not mandatory.

Director Eaken recommended that the Conference of Minority Transportation Officials (COMTO) provide feedback on the job description and Chair Borden offered to reach out to COMTO officials.

Director Eaken suggested that the items in the third paragraph be listed in bullet points to draw attention to their importance.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

David Pilpel stated that he supports the changes to the minimum qualifications. He discussed several formatting issues. and suggested adding something like "coordinate or facilitate public participation and comments by members of the public to the Board, at Board meetings and at other times." He suggested that the committee reach out to or advertise with COMTO, the American Public Transportation Association, other Bay Area transit agencies, the Metropolitan Transportation Commission, the Municipal Executives Association, the Board of Supervisors, and City Board and Commission Secretaries. He also suggested that legal secretaries in the City Attorney's office might be interested.

4. Public Comment

David Pilpel stated that this meeting format is working but suggested that staff review the boiler plate language because some of it isn't current or applicable.
