

BACKGROUND INFORMATION / COMMENTS Stations with bicycles are 6 feet wide and 4 feet tall with a kiosk 7.8 feet tall and map panel at the eastern end of the station. Stations will be solar powered via a panel system that extends vertically from the kiosk. No excavation is necessary. - This site is located on a street with bike lanes						
 no MUNI lines Lyft conducted positive outreach to the adjacent San Francisco State University located at 1600 Holloway Avenue. Lyft contacted Nick Kordesch, who is a Sustainability and Transportation Projects Manager at San Francisco State University. Lyft discussed the station proposal with Nick with no concerns. Lyft also conducted outreach to a multitude of community organizations with no opposition to the proposed bikeshare station. Lyft also informed Supervisor Yee's office of the proposed station location.









Station Site and Plan SF-Z7 HOLLOWAY AVE AT ARELLANO AVE



Hope you are doing well. Wanted to let you know about two bikeshare stations in District 7 that the Bay Wheels team is working on. One is a new station that we've begun outreach for, the other is a station that is moving slightly

Granada Ave at Holloway Ave

We are proposing a bikeshare station on Granada at Holloway, adjacent to Gateway Realty. For over a month, we have emailed, called, and mailed feedback flyers to Gateway Realty and the property owner but have not received a response. Their phone number is disconnected and according to Google, they are permanently closed. Our next step is to visit in person to confirm if they are still open. We have mailed feedback flyers to the surrounding properties and informed Ocean Ave Association, Ingleside Merchants Association and OMI Neighbors in Action. We are working with the Ingleside Merchants Association on potentially promoting local businesses on the station ad panel for 4 weeks if this station gets deployed.

Z7 Holloway Ave at Arellano Ave

We originally proposed a bikeshare station on Holloway at Cardenas but instead are proposing a new location on Holloway at Arellano. We have been working very closely with SFSU and they prefer this location closer to their library. We will be informing all of the same community groups as before (see list below) that this location has changed. Feedback flyers were mailed to the residential properties across the street last week.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) proposes to implement a city-wide bicycle sharing system in San Francisco as part of the regional Bay Area Bicycle Share (BABS) system described in detail below. The current regional bicycle share system in San Francisco is a pilot project managed by the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAAQMD). The regional BABS system will transfer to the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) for program oversight at the end of 2015. As part of a BABS pilot project initiated on August 29, 2013, the system operator installed approximately 35 bicycle share stations with input from the SFMTA, comprising 350 bicycles within the public right-of-way, located generally in the northeast section of the City. The proposed project would maintain and upgrade the existing 35 pilot bicycle share stations, and expand the BABS system within San Francisco to comprise a total of approximately 450 stations and 4,500 bicycles across the City and County of San Francisco (San Francisco).

DETERMINATION:

The City and County of San Francisco decided to carry out or approve the project on December 18, 2015. The San Francisco Board of Supervisors (BOS) approved a coordination agreement with the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), other local partners in the East and South Bay, and the bicycle share operator to carry out the Bay Area Bicycle Share Program, which would be overseen in San Francisco by the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) on December 8, 2015. The agreement was provided to Mayor Lee for his signature and becomes effective upon signing or when ten days have passed. A copy of documents related to this action may be examined at the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, City Hall, 1 Carlton B. Goodlett Place Room 244, San Francisco, CA, 94102 in File Number 151144.

This project in its approved form has been determined to be exempt from environmental review because it would result in the installation of up to 450 bicycle sharing stations throughout San Francisco, primarily within the public right-of-way and on some parcels. The proposed individual stations are portable, modular, and would be solar and battery powered, and would thus not involve excavation or utility connections. The bicycle sharing station equipment is small in scale and massing relative to surrounding buildings or sites. Bicycle facilities and infrastructure are common sights within the urban environment. There would be no potential for significant environmental impacts at either a project or cumulative level. Therefore, the proposed project would be exempt from environmental review under Class 3.
