Merrimac Street, east side, from 116 feet to 159 feet south of China Basin Street (Requires MTAB Approval)

Proposal to establish a two-car on-street shared vehicle pod at the request of Mercy Housing, developer and manager of 691 China Basin, the fronting property.

# Masonic Avenue at Java Street – Stop Signs

## 2(a). ESTABLISH – STOP SIGNS

Masonic Avenue, northbound and southbound, at Java Street, making this intersection an all-way STOP (City Traffic Engineer Approvable)

## 2(b). RESCIND – RIGHT TURN ONLY

Java Street, westbound, at Masonic Avenue (City Traffic Engineer Approvable) (Supervisor District 8) David Sindel, <u>david.sindel@sfmta.com</u>

Proposal to make this intersection an all-way STOP due to grades and geometry. This also allows removal of the right turn only restriction.

18th Street from Noe Street to Hartford Street – Parking Meters

- 3(a). RESCIND 2-HOUR PARKING, 8 AM TO 9 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY EXCEPT VEHICLES WITH AREA S PERMITS ESTABLISH - GENERAL METERED PARKING, 2-Hour Time Limit, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY 18<sup>th</sup> Street, south side, from Noe Street to Hartford Street (Requires MTAB Approval)
- 3(b). ESTABLISH RED ZONE 18<sup>th</sup> Street, south side, from Noe Street to 25 feet west (Requires MTAB Approval)
- 3(c). ESTABLISH METERED YELLOW ZONE, COMMERCIAL LOADING, 30-MINUTE TIME LIMIT, 7 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY 18<sup>th</sup> Street, south side, from 35 feet to 65 feet west of Noe Street. (City Traffic Engineer Approvable)
- 3(d). ESTABLISH GREEN METERED ZONE, 15-MINUTE TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY

18th Street, south side, from 65 feet to 85 feet west of Noe Street (City Traffic Engineer Approvable)

This proposal would install parking meters on the south side of this block of 18th Street with the goal of increasing parking availability on a block with several businesses.

# Harrison Street from 11th Street to 13th Street – Parking Meters

**4(a). RESCIND - 2-HOUR TIME LIMIT, 7AM TO 6PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY** Harrison Street, east side from 11<sup>th</sup> Street to 13<sup>th</sup> Street. (Requires MTAB Approval)

# 4(b). ESTABLISH - GENERAL METERED PARKING, NO TIME LIMIT, 9AM TO 6PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY

Harrison Street, west side, from Norfolk Street to 13th Street (Requires MTAB Approval) Harrison Street, east side, from 11th Street to 13th Street (Requires MTAB Approval) (Supervisor District 6) Becca Homa, <u>becca.homa@sfmta.com</u>



This proposal would install parking meters on Harrison Street, a block with several businesses and a new high-density mixed-used development to facilitate increased parking turnover and availability.

The 706 Mission Street development project is constructing new street and sidewalk improvements along both sides of the Stevenson Street between 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and the western terminus of Stevenson Street by the Four Seasons hotel driveway. These improvements include the proposed speed table on Stevenson Street, west of 3<sup>rd</sup> Street.

Proposal to widen sidewalks on Jerrold Avenue and establish a midblock crossing with Rectangular Rapid Flash Beacons (RRFBs) at the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission building.

# • Items denoted with (Engineer) can be given approval by the City Traffic Engineer after the public hearing. Otherwise, the SFMTA Board will make the final approval at a later date based on the outcome at the public hearing.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Whether the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, this decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If a City Traffic Engineer disapproves a parking or traffic modification and a member of the public requests SFMTA review of that decision, the additional review shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. City Traffic Engineer decisions will be posted on

Final SFMTA Decisions involving certain parking or traffic modifications, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to <u>Ordinance 127-18</u>.
