ACCESSIBLE MEETING POLICY

The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors/Parking Authority Commission meeting will be held in Room 400, at 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place (400 Van Ness Ave.), San Francisco, CA. The closest accessible BART station is the Civic Center Station at United Nations Plaza and Market Street. Accessible MUNI lines serving this location are: MUNI Metro Lines J-Church, K-Ingleside, L-Taraval, M-Ocean View, N-Judah and T-Third at Van Ness and Civic Center Stations; F-Market; 19-Polk, 47-Van Ness; 49-Mission-Van Ness; 5-Fulton; 6-Parnassus, 21-Hayes; 9-San Bruno; and 71-Haight Noriega. For information about MUNI accessible services call 701.4485.

The meeting room is wheelchair accessible. Accessible curbside parking spaces have been designated on the Van Ness Avenue and McAllister Street perimeters of City Hall for mobility-impaired persons. There is accessible parking available within the Civic Center Underground Parking Garage at the corner of McAllister and Polk Streets, and within the Performing Arts Parking Garage at Grove and Franklin Streets.

CONSENT CALENDAR

All matters listed hereunder constitute a Consent Calendar, are considered to be routine by the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors and will be acted upon by a single vote. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a member of the Board of Directors or the public so requests, in which event the matter shall be removed from the Consent Calendar and considered as a separate item.
- (10.1) Approving the following traffic modifications:

- A. ESTABLISH RED ZONE Judah Street, south side, from 39th Avenue to 26 feet westerly.
- B. ESTABLISH NO LEFT TURN EXCEPT MUNI California Street, westbound, at Presidio Ave.
- C. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY NO STOPPING ANYTIME, 12:01 AM TO 7 AM, DAILY Stockton Street, east side, from 89 feet to 182 feet north of North Point Street.
- D. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA "X" ELIGIBILITY 2068 3rd Street.
- E. ESTABLISH STOP SIGNS Jefferson Street, eastbound, at Webster Street; and Jefferson Street, westbound, at Fillmore Street.
- F. ESTABLISH OVERSIZED VEHICLE RESTRICTION (NO PARKING, MIDNIGHT TO 6 AM, DAILY FOR VEHICLES MORE THAN 7 FEET TALL OR 22 FEET LONG) Pierce Street, both sides, between Post Street and Sutter Street; and Steiner Street, both sides, between Post Street and Sutter Street.
- G. ESTABLISH STOP SIGNS Bemis Street, eastbound, at Miguel Street.
- H. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY NO STOPPING ANYTIME Washington Street, north side, from 10 feet to 30 feet west of Leavenworth Street; and Washington Street, south side, from 10 feet to 30 feet west of Leavenworth Street.
- I. ESTABLISH RED ZONE Frederick Street, north side, from west crosswalk at Willard Street to 23 feet easterly.
- J. ESTABLISH STOP SIGN Head Street, eastbound, at Ashton Avenue.
- K. ESTABLISH STOP SIGN Nido Avenue, southbound, at Turk Street.
- L. ESTABLISH STOP SIGNS Sargent Street, eastbound and westbound, at Head Street.
- M. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY NO PARKING ANYTIME Mission Street, east side, from 7.5 feet to 25.5 feet south of France Avenue.
- N. ESTABLISH BUS ZONE Laguna Street, east side, from 75 feet to 80 feet north of Hayes St.
- O. RESCIND 2-HOUR PARKING, 9 AM TO 5 PM. MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT VEHICLES WITH AREA "D" PERMITS ESTABLISH 4-HOUR PARKING, 9 AM TO 5 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT VEHICLES WITH AREA "D" PERMITS Chenery Street, both sides, between Roanoke Street and Mateo Street.
- P. ESTABLISH NO PARKING ANYTIME ESTABLISH SIDEWALK WIDENING 10th Street, east side, from 18 feet north of Stevenson Street to 71 feet southerly. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution. The proposed action is an Approval Action as defined by S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31.)
- (10.2) Authorizing the award of Purchase Order No. 4 for Contract No. 1226, Automatic Train Control System Final Cutover Installation Phase project with Thales Transport & Security in the amount of \$2,511,850, for a term not to exceed 578 calendar days. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)
- (10.3) Authorizing the Director to execute a Lease between C&E Haas Development Company and the SFMTA for 1 Bayview Park Road as a base station for the SFMTA radio operations, with an initial 10-year term plus extension options; and adopting and incorporating the categorical exemption for this lease. (Explanatory documents include a staff report, lease, terms, budget and resolution.)

(10.4) Authorizing the SFMTA to use a Construction Manager/General Contractor project delivery method for the Van Ness Bus Rapid Transit Project and authorizing the Director to seek approval from the Board of Supervisors for a Project-specific ordinance to implement the CM/GC delivery method. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)

ESTABLISH TOW AWAY NO STOPPING ANYTIME 11th Street, east side, from Market Street to 108 feet southerly; 11th Street, east side, from Harrison Street to 165 feet northerly; 11th Street, east side, from Harrison Street to 106 feet southerly; Bayshore Boulevard, east side, from 730 feet to 805 feet south of Jerrold Avenue; Bayshore Boulevard, west side, from Oakdale Avenue to 110 feet southerly; Bayshore Boulevard, east side, from Flower Street to 145 feet southerly; Bayshore Boulevard, west side, from Cortland Avenue to 110 feet southerly; and Bayshore Boulevard, east side, from 103 to 125 feet north of Cortland Avenue.
 - B. ESTABLISH METERED MOTORCYCLE PARKING 11th Street, east side, from 108 to 154 feet south of Market Street.
 - C. ESTABLISH BLUE ZONE 11th Street, east side, from 5 feet to 30 feet north of Folsom Street; and 11th Street, west side, from 5 feet to 30 feet south of Folsom Street.
 - D. RESCIND BUS ZONE 11th Street, east side, from Folsom Street to 75 feet northerly; 11th Street, west side, from Folsom Street to 75 feet southerly; Bayshore Boulevard, west side, from 40 to 120 feet north of Oakdale Avenue; Bayshore Boulevard, east side, from Oakdale Avenue to 120 feet southerly; Bayshore Boulevard, west side, from 20 to 100 feet north of Cortland Avenue; and Bayshore Boulevard, east side, from Marengo Street to 100 feet northerly.
 - E. RESCIND GENERAL METERED PARKING 11th Street, east side, from Folsom Street to 25 feet southerly; and 11th Street, west side, from Folsom Street to 19 feet northerly.
 - F. RESCIND FLAG STOP Bayshore Boulevard, east side, 270 feet south of Jerrold Avenue; and Bayshore Boulevard, west side, at "380" Bayshore Boulevard.
 - G. ESTABLISH YELLOW METERED LOADING ZONE (7AM to 6PM, Mon-Sat) 11th Street, west side, from Harrison Street to 40 feet northerly. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.
