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#### **PURPOSE**

To approve various routine parking and traffic modifications.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS AND TRANSIT FIRST POLICY PRINCIPLES:

Goal 1: Create a safer transportation experience for everyone

Objective 1.1: Achieve Vision Zero by eliminating all traffic deaths.

Objective 1.2: Improve the safety of the Transit System.

Goal 2: Make transit and other sustainable modes of transportation the most attractive and preferred means of travel

Objective 2.1: Improve transit service.

Objective 2.2: Enhance and expand use of the city's sustainable modes of

transportation.

Objective 2.3: Manage congestion and parking demand to support the Transit First

Policy.

This action supports the following SFMTA Transit First Policy Principles:

- 1. To ensure quality of life and economic health in San Francisco, the primary objective of the transportation system must be the safe and efficient movement of people and goods.
- 2. Public transit, including taxis and vanpools, is an economically and environmentally sound alternative to transportation by individual automobiles. Within San Francisco, travel by public transit, by bicycle and on foot must be an attractive alternative to travel by private automobile.
- 3. Decisions regarding the use of limited public street and sidewalk space shall encourage the use of public rights of way by pedestrians, bicyclists, and public transit, and shall strive to reduce traffic and improve public health and safety.

#### **ITEMS**

The following items were considered at Public Hearing on September 17, 2021

A. ESTABLISH – 1-HOUR PARKING, 7 AM TO 6 PM, EVERYDAY EXCEPT SUNDAYS – Irving Street, north side, between 46th Avenue and 47th Avenue (Requested by resident).

Modification A added a parking time limit to encourage parking turnover and address reports of driveway blocking.

B. ESTABLISH - RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA R – 555 Golden Gate Avenue (Eligibility only, no signs), (Requested by resident).

Modification B added RPP eligibility to the residents of 555 Golden Gate Avenue, so they can obtain permits and park their vehicles within RPP Area R.

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- C. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA U 345-363 6th Street (Eligibility-only, no signs) (Requested by resident).
  - Modification C added 345 and 363 6th Street to RPP Area U so residents will be eligible to purchase permits and park within the general Area U.
- D. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA C 610 Hyde Street (Eligibility only, no signs) (Requested by resident).
  - Modification D added 610 Hyde Street to RPP Area C so residents will be eligible to purchase permits and park within the general Area C.
- E. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA C 1005 Larkin Street and 1002 Post Street (eligibility only, no signs) (Requested by resident).
  - Modification E extended RPP area eligibility to a building on a metered block near Area C.
- F. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA S 3914-3916 24th Street (eligibility only, no signs) (Requested by resident).

Modification F extended RPP area eligibility to a building on a metered block near Area S.

## **ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW**

The proposed traffic and parking modifications are subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). CEQA provides a categorical exemption from environmental review for operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301.
