Pursuant to SFMTA Order No. 5342 adopted October 17, 2014, the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency will hold a public hearing to solicit public input on the following proposed changes. The hearing will be held as follows:

ESTABLISH - PERPENDICULAR PARKING

Noe Street, east side, from 29th Street to Valley Street, Valley Street, south side, from Noe Street to Sanchez Street

ESTABLISH – NO PARKING ANY TIME

- A. Avalon Street, south side, from Vienna Street to 30 feet westerly
- B. Avalon Street, north side, from Vienna Street to 30 feet westerly
- C. Avalon Street, south side, from Vienna Street to 17 feet easterly *
- D. Avalon Street, north side, from Vienna Street to 45 feet easterly

ESTABLISH – RED ZONE

Battery Street, east side from Pine Street to 48 feet northerly (extend existing red zone, removes yellow loading meters #324-01020 and #324-01040) Battery Street, west side, from Pine Street to 28 feet northerly (extends existing red zone, removes yellow loading meter #324-01010)

<u>ESTABLISH – STOP SIGN</u>

Cleveland Street, westbound, at 7th Street, stopping the stem of this "T" intersection Sherman Street, southbound, at Harrison Street, stopping the stem of this "T" intersection

ESTABLISH - RED ZONE

Harrison Street, north side, from 9 feet to 27 feet east of Sherman Street (extends existing 9-foot red zone to 19 feet, removes 1 general metered spaces) *

ESTABLISH – NO PARKING ANY TIME 12:01 AM TO 6 AM EVERY DAY FOR VEHICLES MORE THAN SEVEN FEET TALL OR 22 FEET LONG

Ocean Avenue frontage road, north side, from Phelan Avenue to 73 feet westerly

ESTABLISH – NO PARKING ANY TIME

Ocean Avenue frontage road, north side, from Geneva Avenue to Phelan Avenue (32 foot zone across from 931 and 935 Ocean Avenue)

ESTABLISH – STOP SIGN

Belcher Street, southbound, at 14th Street, stopping the stem of this "T" intersection

Items denoted with an asterisk (*) can be given final approval at the public hearing and such approval constitutes the CEQA **Approval Action** under S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.04(h). Otherwise, the SFMTA Board will make the final approval at a later date based on the outcome at the public hearing.

Marsily Street, from Bosworth Street to St. Mary's Avenue, (00 – 199 blocks) Bosworth Street, from Cuvier Street to Marsily Street, north side only (100 block)

ESTABLISH – RESIDENTAIL PERMIT PARKING AREA Z, 2-HOUR PARKING 8 AM TO 6

PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT VEHICLES WITH AREA Z PERMITS

Dolores Street, both sides, from 21st Street to 22nd Street (800 block)

ESTABLISH - STOP SIGN

Athens Street, westbound, at Naples Street, stopping stem of "T" intersection

ESTABLISH - STOP SIGN

Conkling Street, southbound, at Silver Avenue, stopping stem of "T" intersection

ESTABLISH - STOP SIGN

Innes Street, westbound, at Phelps Street, stopping stem of "T" intersection

ESTABLISH - RED ZONE

Phelps Street, east side, from Innes Street to 25 feet southerly

ESTABLISH - TOW AWAY NO STOPPING FIRE LANE

Key Avenue, north side, from Bayview Park fire access road gate to 52.5 feet westerly

ESTABLISH – NO PARKING ANY TIME

ESTABLISH – SIDEWALK WIDENING

8th Street, east side, from 178 feet to 262 feet north of Mission Street (sidewalk widened from 10 to 15 feet, Removes 11 metered spaces #15-41, 33 8th Street)

ESTABLISH – ABILITY OF PERMITTED COMMUTER SHUTTLE BUS TO USE MUNI BUS ZONE

Eddy Street, south side, from Mason Street to 120 feet westerly * Harrison Street, west side, from 2nd Street to 80 feet southerly *
