BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

Amending Transportation Code, Division II, Sections 302 and 303 to reduce the Trial Courts Courthouse Construction fee for parking violations as a result of the fulfillment of the City's bond indebtedness on the Civic Center Courthouse on April 1, 2021.

SUMMARY:

- State law authorizes the City to establish a courthouse construction fund for the purpose
 of assisting in the acquisition, rehabilitation, construction, and financing of courtrooms or
 courtroom buildings.
- Since state law requires the City to place certain surcharges on court filing fees and court-imposed fines, penalties, and forfeitures into the courthouse construction fund, the Board of Supervisors established the Trial Courts Courthouse Construction Fund in order to implement this law.
- In Resolution No. 713-92, the Board of Supervisors authorized an additional penalty of \$2.50 for every parking offense, \$1.50 of which was dedicated to offset the bond indebtedness on the Civic Center courthouse.
- On April 1, 2021, the City's bond indebtedness on the Civic Center Courthouse concluded and there is an ordinance pending before the Board of Supervisors to eliminate the Trial Courts Courthouse Construction Fund.
- Since the City has retired its debt on this courthouse facility, the proposed Transportation Code legislation will reduce the corresponding fee which is added to parking citations.
- After reducing the fee by \$1.50, the base fine parking fine will be rounded up by fifty cents for those fines below the state maximum of \$100 for a total decrease of \$1, and those above \$100 will be rounded down by fifty cents for a total decrease of \$2.
- Pursuant to the SFMTA Board's Rules of Order and Charter Section 16.112, advertisements were placed in the City's official newspaper to provide notice of the December 7, 2021 meeting.

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PURPOSE

Amending Transportation Code, Division II, Sections 302 and 303 to reduce the Trial Courts Courthouse Construction fee for parking violations as a result of the fulfillment of the City's bond indebtedness on the Civic Center Courthouse on April 1, 2021.

STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS AND TRANSIT FIRST POLICY PRINCIPLES

This action supports the following SFMTA Strategic Plan Goal:

10. Position the agency for financial success. Ensure that near-term resource allocation is efficient and secure reliable revenue to meet the city's long-term transportation vision

This action supports the following SFMTA Transit First Policy Principle:

1. To ensure quality of life and economic health in San Francisco, the primary objective of the transportation system must be the safe and efficient movement of people and goods.

DESCRIPTION

California Government Code Sections 76100 and 70625 authorized the Board of Supervisors (BOS) to establish a Courthouse Construction Fund for the purpose of assisting the City and County of San Francisco in the acquisition, rehabilitation, construction, and financing of courtrooms. Since state law requires the City to place certain surcharges on court filing fees and court-imposed fines, penalties, and forfeitures into the courthouse construction fund, the Board of Supervisors established the Trial Courts Courthouse Construction Fund in order to implement this law. In Resolution No. 713-92, the Board of Supervisors authorized an additional penalty of \$2.50 for every parking offense, \$1.50 of which was dedicated to offset the bond indebtedness on the Civic Center courthouse.

On April 1, 2021, the City's bond indebtedness on the Civic Center Courthouse concluded and there is an ordinance pending before the Board of Supervisors to eliminate the Trial Courts Courthouse Construction Fund. Since the City has retired its debt on this courthouse facility, the proposed Transportation Code legislation will reduce the corresponding \$1.50 fee assessed on citations for parking violations. Funds collected from this fee after April 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021 were used to support other expenditures in the Courthouse Construction Fund including the lease of 575 Polk Street. Any collections made in FY21-22 will be returned to the General Fund to offset other revenue-side shortfalls of the Courthouse Construction Fund.

In order to eliminate the \$1.50 fee, parking fines below the below the state law maximum of \$100 will be rounded up by fifty cents for a total decrease of \$1, and those above the \$100 state law maximum will be rounded down by fifty cents for a total decrease of \$2. Maintaining fine levels as whole numbers streamlines the administrative of processing and payment of parking fines.

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STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

This is an administrative action based on the close-out of the state mandated fee. No stakeholder engagement was conducted.

PUBLIC OUTREACH

Pursuant to Charter Section 16.112, advertisements were placed in the City's official newspaper regarding this public hearing. The advertisements ran in the San Francisco Examiner on November 24-26, 2021, November 28, 2021 and December 1, 2021 to provide notice that the SFMTA Board of Directors will hold a public hearing on December 7, 2021 to consider the changes to parking fines.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED

This action is required due to the fulfillment of the City's bond indebtedness on the Civic Center Courthouse on April 1, 2021.

FUNDING IMPACT

The \$1.50 Local Courthouse fee currently collected is a pass-through to the City's General Fund, and thus reducing the applicable fines will not result in a fiscal impact. It is estimated that the rounding of various fines up by fifty cents will result in an approximately \$100,000 increase in parking fine revenue through Fiscal Year 2022.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

On October 22, 2021, the SFMTA, under authority delegated by the Planning Department, determined that the Local Courthouse Assessment Fee Modification is not a "project" under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Sections 15060(c) and 15378(b).

A copy of the CEQA determination is on file with the Secretary to the SFMTA Board of Directors and is incorporated herein by reference.

Section 1. Article 300 of Division II of the Transportation Code is hereby amended by Section 302 and 303, to read as follows:

SEC. 302. TRANSPORTATION CODE PENALTY SCHEDULE.

Violation of any of the following subsections of the Transportation Code shall be punishable by the fines set forth below.

charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Transportation Code that are explicitly

shown in this ordinance as additions or deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears

under the official title of the ordinance.
