15. Approving Modification No. 143 to Contract No. 1300, Third Street Light Rail Program Phase 2 - Central Subway Stations, Surface, Track and Systems with Tutor Perini Corporation to resolve Contractor's and subcontractors' claims for compensation for additional work and delay resulting from City-directed design changes and unexpected site conditions, which increases the contract amount \$27,924,758 and to extend the Project Final Completion date to June 18, 2022. In conjunction with bilateral Contract Modification No. 144, which reduces the contract amount by \$10,500,000, the total net increase of Contract Modifications No. 143 and 144 is \$17,424,758, for a total modified contract value of \$1,158,241,864.70; and making environmental review findings. California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.
