# 5. <u>Leavenworth Street, between Sutter Street and Bush Street – Unmetered Motorcycle</u> <u>Parking</u>

Leavenworth Street, east side, from 90 feet to 110 feet north of Sutter Street (20-foot zone for six motorcycle stalls) (Supervisor District 3) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Kenya Wheeler, kenya.wheeler@sfmta.com

Proposal to install unmetered motorcycle parking spaces to meet increased motorcycle and scooter parking demand.



Pacheco Street, north side, between 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue, and Pacheco Street, south side, between 9th Avenue and Alton Avenue – Residential Permit Parking Extension Rescission

#### 6(a). RESCIND – RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA T ELIGIBILITY Pacheco Street, north side, between 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue Pacheco Street, south side, between 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Alton Avenue

Proposal to remove parking restrictions as petitioned by most residents and allow anyone to park on this section of the block without restrictions.

#### 7. <u>Geary Boulevard between Gough Street and Wood Street – Speed Limit</u> RESCIND – 35 MPH SPEED LIMIT ESTABLISH – 30 MPH SPEED LIMIT

Geary Expressway between Gough Street and Presidio Avenue and Geary Boulevard between Presidio Avenue and Wood Street (on the depressed section) (Supervisor Districts 1, 2, & 5) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Sam Alexander, sam.alexander@sfmta.com

Proposal to reduce speed limit based on an updated speed survey.

8. <u>Bruce Avenue at Edgar Avenue – STOP Sign</u> ESTABLISH – STOP SIGN

Bruce Avenue, westbound, at Edgar Avenue, stopping this dead end street (Supervisor District 11) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Simon Qin, simon.qin@sfmta.com

Proposal to stop the dead end of this T-intersection to clarify right-of-way.

## 9. <u>600 Block of Congo Street – No Parking Anytime</u> ESTABLISH – NO PARKING ANYTIME

Congo Street, northwest corner, from south property line 681 to west property line 729 (74-foot total) (Supervisor District 7) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Simon Qin, simon.qin@sfmta.com

Proposal to remove 1 parking space to provide more room for turns in both directions of traffic at 90-degree bend on Congo Street.



## 10. <u>Crystal Street at Alemany Boulevard – Tow-Away, No Parking Anytime</u> ESTABLISH – TOW-AWAY, NO PARKING ANYTIME

Crystal Street, east side, from Alemany Boulevard to 65 feet southerly Crystal Street, west side, from Alemany Boulevard to 40 feet southerly (Supervisor District 11) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Simon Qin, simon.qin@sfmta.com

Proposal to establish parking restrictions on the north terminus of Crystal Street provide better fire access and traffic movement.

## 11. Ingerson Avenue and Redondo Street – STOP Sign ESTABLISH – STOP SIGN

Redondo Street, northbound, at Ingerson Avenue, stopping the stem of this "T" intersection (Supervisor District 10) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Simon Qin, simon.qin@sfmta.com

SFMTA recommends stopping the stem of this "T" intersection to better clarify the right-ofway.

# 12. <u>Holly Park Circle at Appleton Avenue – Red Zone</u> ESTABLISH – RED ZONE

Holly Park Circle, east side, from existing 10-foot red zone at Appleton Avenue to 20 feet easterly (extends existing red zone by 20 feet) (Supervisor District 9) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Simon Qin, simon.qin@sfmta.com

Proposal to extend red zone to improve pedestrian visibility.

#### 13. <u>Plymouth Avenue at Sadowa Street – STOP Signs</u> ESTABLISH – STOP SIGNS

Plymouth Avenue, northbound and southbound, at Sadowa Street, making this intersection an all-way STOP (Supervisor District 11) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Simon Qin, simon.qin@sfmta.com

Proposal to make this intersection an all-way STOP to better clarify right of way.

## 14. <u>Arelious Walker Drive, between Donner Avenue and Carroll Avenue – Speed Cushion</u> ESTABLISH – SPEED CUSHION

Arelious Walker Drive, between Donner Avenue and Carroll Avenue (1 3-lump speed cushion) (Supervisor District 10) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Elliot Goodrich, elliot.goodrich@sfmta.com

Proposal to install traffic calming devices at the request of block residents. SFMTA collected data and confirmed that typical motorist speeds exceed agency thresholds to qualify for traffic calming. Speed cushion is temporary pending additional infrastructure upgrades related to a nearby development project.



## 15. <u>Hampshire Street, between 22<sup>nd</sup> Street and 23<sup>rd</sup> Street – Speed</u> Cushions ESTABLISH – SPEED CUSHIONS

Hampshire Street, between 22nd Street and 23rd Street (2 3-lump speed cushions) (Supervisor District 9) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Elliot Goodrich, elliot.goodrich@sfmta.com

Proposal to install traffic calming devices at the request of block residents. SFMTA collected data and confirmed that typical motorist speeds exceed agency thresholds to qualify for traffic calming.

## 16. <u>Lakeview Avenue, between Granada Avenue and Miramar Avenue – Speed Cushion</u> ESTABLISH – SPEED CUSHION

Lakeview Avenue, between Granada Avenue and Miramar Avenue (1 3-lump speed cushion) (Supervisor District 11) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Elliot Goodrich, elliot.goodrich@sfmta.com

Proposal to install traffic calming devices at the request of block residents. SFMTA collected data and confirmed that typical motorist speeds exceed agency thresholds to qualify for traffic calming.

# 17. <u>Shipley Street</u>, <u>between</u> 4<sup>th</sup> <u>Street and 6<sup>th</sup> Street –</u> <u>Speed</u> <u>Cushions</u> ESTABLISH – SPEED CUSHIONS</u>

Proposing one new red zone with one meter removal.



## 19. <u>Paris Steet and Geneva Avenue – Red Zone</u> ESTABLISH - RED ZONE

Paris Street, west side, from 3 to 21 feet north of Geneva Avenue (rescinds meter # 602-08980) (Supervisor District 11) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Maurice Growney, maurice.growney@sfmta.com

As part of the Citywide HIN Daylighting project, this repurposes one GMP space for daylighting.

## 20. <u>Clay Street at Lyon Street – Bike Share Station</u> ESTABLISH – NO STOPPING EXCEPT BICYCLES ESTABLISH – BIKE SHARE STATION

Clay Street, south side, from 138 feet to 206 feet east of Lyon Street (63-foot bike share station in parking lane with red zones on either side) (Supervisor District 2) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Laura Stonehill, laura.stonehill@sfmta.com

Proposal to establish a Bay Wheels bike share station in the parking lane on Clay Street midblock between Lyon Street and Baker Street, adjacent to the Presidio Branch Library.

Jones Street, west side, from 114 feet to 134 feet south of Ellis Street (removes GMP space #317).



## 21(b). RESCIND - RIGHT TURN ONLY LANE

Jones Street, southbound, at Turk Street.

# 21(c). ESTABLISH - UNMETERED WHITE ZONE, PASSENGER LOADING, 7AM TO 10PM DAILY

Jones Street, west side, from 21 feet to 63 feet north of Golden Gate Avenue (converts GMP spaces #103 & #105 into a white zone).

## 21(d). ESTABLISH - METERED YELLOW ZONE, COMMERCIAL LOADING, 7AM TO 6PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY

Jones Street, west side, from 114 feet to 134 feet south of Ellis Street (converts GMP space #317 into a yellow zone).

## 21(e). ESTABLISH - LEFT TURN ONLY LANE

Jones Street, southbound, at O'Farrell Street. (Supervisor District 5) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Shahram Shariati, Shahram.Shariati@sfmta.com

This proposal makes the following changes on Jones Street between Geary Street and Golden Gate Avenue; Converts travel lane into left turn only lane, Reduces travel lanes from three to two, Adds Painted Safety Zones (PSZs) to existing daylighting, and updates color curb zones.

# ADJOURNMENT

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Whether the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, this decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If a City Traffic Engineer disapproves a parking or traffic modification and a member of the public requests SFMTA review of that decision, the additional review shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. City Traffic Engineer decisions will be posted on <u>SFMTA.com/EngineeringResults</u> by 5 p.m. on the Friday following the public hearing. Final SFMTA Decisions involving certain parking or traffic modifications, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of



Supervisors pursuant to <u>Ordinance 127-18</u>. Information about the review process can be found at <u>SFMTA.com/BOSAppeal</u>.
