Proposal to stop the stem of this T-intersection to clarify the right-of-way.

7. 24th Street at Capp Street - Part-Time Bus Zone

ESTABLISH – PART-TIME BUS ZONE, 12 AM TO 8 AM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY 24th Street, north side, from Capp Street to 167 feet easterly (meters 3222, 3220, 3218, 3214, 3212, 3210, 3208) (Supervisor District 9) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Hester Yu, hester.yu@sfmta.com

Proposal to establish a part-time bus zone to provide additional layover space for AC Transit and Muni in the mornings for the bus zone on 24th Street, north side, between Mission Street and Capp Street.

8. <u>Valencia Street at Mission Street – Bus Zone</u> ESTABLISH – BUS ZONE

Valencia Street, east side, from 10 feet to 70 feet north of Mission Street (removes metered spaces 1685, 1683, 1681) (Supervisor District 9) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Hester Yu, hester.yu@sfmta.com

Proposal to establish new bus zone for the 36-Teresita to accommodate service changes for the 12-Folsom/Pacific and 36-Teresita.

Potrero Hill - Missouri Street 100 block - Parking Time Limits

- 9(a). RESCIND 4-HOUR TIME LIMIT, 8 AM TO 6 PM, MON-FRI Missouri Street, west side, from 17th Street to 100 feet southerly Missouri Street, east side, from 17th Street to 103 feet southerly
- 9(b). ESTABLISH 4-HOUR TIME LIMIT, 8 AM TO 6 PM, MON-FRI Missouri Street, west side, from 17th Street to 166 feet southerly Missouri Street, east side, from 17th Street to 173 feet southerly (Supervisor District 10) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Andy Thornley, andy.thornley@sfmta.com



This proposal would address a gap in parking regulations on the 100 block of Missouri Street inadvertently omitted from regulations approved in 2020.

Categorically exempt from Environmental Review: CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 Class 1(c): Operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Whether the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, this decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If a City Traffic Engineer disapproves a parking or traffic modification and a member of the public requests SFMTA review of that decision, the additional review shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. City Traffic Engineer decisions will be posted on SFMTA.com/EngineeringResults by 5 p.m. on the Friday following the public hearing. Final SFMTA Decisions involving certain parking or traffic modifications, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to Ordinance 127-18.
