TO: San Francisco Taxi Drivers

SUBJECT: Enforcement Reminder: Looping, Staging, Solicitation and Meters

The airport has noticed an increase in taxi drivers soliciting customers without passing through the proper virtual and physical queues, and the Airport has increased enforcement. Specifically, Taxi drivers are reminded that the following are prohibited:

- Looping, or circling through the terminals more than once
- Improper staging, for example at a terminal curb that is not a taxi stand
- Soliciting fares other than through the approved taxi pickup process
- Not starting the meter, even if the customer agrees to a flat fare

If our records show that a driver looped or staged improperly, that driver will be suspended for 24 hours or longer in the case of repeated violations. Drivers who do not turn on their meter are subject to a fine of \$182 levied by SFMTA. Confirmed cases of soliciting will result in a minimum 7-day suspension, or more for repeated violations, in addition to an SFMTA-imposed fine of up to \$150.

The airport is also acting against solicitors who are not authorized taxi drivers, including increased customer education in multiple languages and additional enforcement.
