- 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY 10th Avenue, 400-500-600 blocks, both sides, between Geary Blvd. and Cabrillo Street.
- C. ESTABLISH NO PARKING ANYTIME Coral Road, south side, between Carolina and Wisconsin Streets.
