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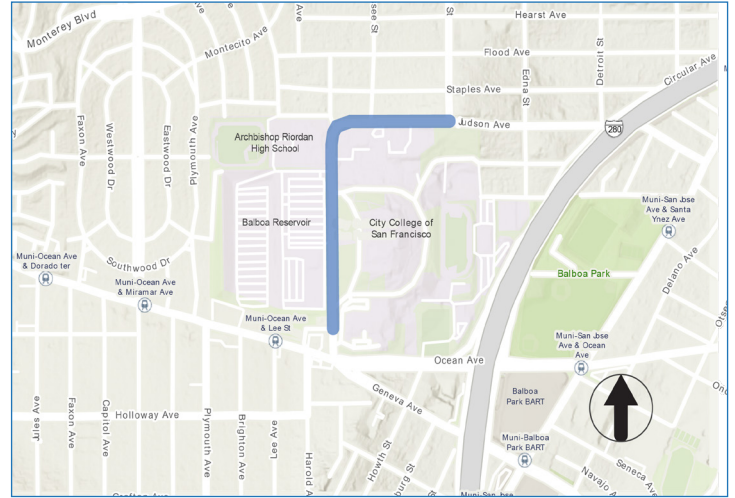
## Project Focus

The Frida Kahlo Quick-Build Project aims to improve safety for people walking and bicycling on Frida Kahlo Way and Judson Avenue.

The project will connect the Sunnyside and Ingleside neighborhoods, Ocean Avenue commercial corridor, City College, and planned residential development on the Balboa Reservoir.

The project will upgrade pedestrian crossings, add a protected bikeway, consider changes to improve transit access and reliability, and review curb management for schools in the area.

## Vision Zero and the Quick-Build Program

**Vision Zero** is a citywide policy with the goal of eliminating all serious and fatal traffic collisions. The **Vision Zero Quick-Build Program** is an SFMTA effort to quickly implement pedestrian and bicycle safety improvements. The SFMTA implements quick-build safety projects to decrease the number of people fatally and severely injured on San Francisco streets, resulting in progress towards the SFMTA’s Vision Zero commitment. ## Project Design Elements

The project team will employ a tailored set of quick-build design elements to improve safety and access for people walking and biking, including:

A two-way protected bikeway on the east side of Frida Kahlo Way and south side of Judson Ave to physically separate people riding bikes from people driving. The bikeway will replace existing parking on the east side of Frida Kahlo Way but vehicle travel lanes will be unaffected. [Click here](#) to learn more about protected bikeways,

Bus boarding islands provide level, in-roadway boarding for people riding the 43 bus line to improve reliability and access for all riders. [Click here](#) to learn more about bus boarding islands. Bus stop relocation and consolidation improves Muni reliability and better locates bus zones for safe access by Riordan High School and City College students.
