SAN FRANCISCO MUNICIPAL TRANSPORTATION AGENCY

BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

Amending Transportation Code, Division II, Section 801 to update parking restricted hours and restricted areas of 11th Street unless authorized by the Department of Public Health or the Fire Department to conduct inspections of mobile food facilities.

SUMMARY:

- The proposed parking restrictions were requested by the San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH), the San Francisco Fire Department (SFFD), and the City Administrator.
- Amendments to the Transportation Code are required to implement parking restrictions on 11th Street to designate on-street parking spaces for inspection of mobile food facilities during certain hours.
- The proposed action is the Approval Action as defined by S. F. Administrative Code Chapter 31.
- The proposed action for adopting parking restrictions is the Final SFMTA Decision as defined by Ordinance 127-18. Final SFMTA Decisions can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors. 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PURPOSE

Amending Transportation Code, Division II, Section 801 to update parking restriction hours on portions of 11th Street unless authorized by the Department of Public Health or the Fire Department so both departments can conduct inspections of mobile food facilities.

STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS AND TRANSIT FIRST POLICY PRINCIPLES

These actions support the following SFMTA Strategic Plan Goal and Objective:

Goal 7: Build stronger relationships with stakeholders.

This action bears no relation, positive or negative, to the City's Transit First Policy principles.

DESCRIPTION

The San Francisco Department of Public Health (DPH) and the San Francisco Fire Department (SFFD) conduct inspections of mobile food facilities to ensure public safety and safe food preparation. DPH, SFFD, and the City Administrator have requested assistance with designating on-street parking to conduct these required inspections near the new permit center at 1500 Mission Street. To provide designated on-street parking spaces for these mobile food facilities during inspection hours, the Transportation Code must be amended to update parking restricted hours and areas on 11th Street.

SFMTA staff agreed to pursue these parking restrictions on behalf of these City departments. The proposed parking restrictions would be in effect from Monday through Friday from 7:00 am to 4:00 pm and are as follows:

- A. RESCIND TOW-AWAY, NO PARKING, EXCEPT SAN FRANCISCO DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH (SFDPH) OR SAN FRANCISCO FIRE DEPARTMENT (SFFD) PERMITTED VEHICLES, 9 AM TO 12 PM, MONDAY THROUGH THURSDAY AND YELLOW ZONE, COMMERCIAL LOADING, 7 AM TO 9 AM AND 12 PM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH THURSDAY AND 7AM TO 6PM, FRIDAY TO SATURDAY
- B. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY, NO PARKING, EXCEPT SAN FRANCISCO DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH (SFDPH) OR SAN FRANCISCO FIRE DEPARTMENT (SFFD) PERMITTED VEHICLES, 7 AM TO 4 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY
 - 11th Street, east side from 67 to 133 feet north of Mission Street

STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

The Mayor's Office and other staff continued to stay in communication with members of the

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working group after installation which resulted in the proposed amendment to better suit changing needs.

The SFMTA held a public hearing for the proposed updated parking restricted hours on May 3, 2024. No objections to the proposed Transportation Code legislation were raised and no comments were submitted by members of the public.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED

An alternative considered by SFMTA staff was not to update proposed restricted parking hours on 11th Street and not provide DPH and SFFD with designated on-street parking for inspections. This alternative was rejected because it wouldn't be responsive to our City partners who needed an on-street space close to the permit center so that both Fire and DPH could inspect the vehicles at the same time. Additionally, it would go against the working group of 20+ members who worked for months to find a good location.

FUNDING IMPACT

There is no funding impact.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The proposed parking restrictions are subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). CEQA provides a categorical exemption from environmental review for minor alterations to existing streets as defined in Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301.

On April 23, 2024, the SFMTA, under authority delegated by the Planning Department, determined (Case Number 2024-003552ENV) that the proposed parking restrictions are categorically exempt from CEQA as defined in Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301.

The proposed action is the Approval Action as defined by the S. F. Administrative Code Chapter 31.

A copy of the CEQA determination is on file with the Secretary to the SFMTA Board of Directors and may be found in the records of the Planning Department at 1650 Mission Street in San Francisco, and is incorporated herein by reference.

OTHER APPROVALS RECEIVED OR STILL REQUIRED

The proposed action for adopting parking restrictions is the Final SFMTA Decision as defined by Ordinance 127-18. Final SFMTA Decisions can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors.

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The City Attorney's Office has reviewed this calendar item.

RECOMMENDATION

SFMTA staff recommend that the SFMTA Board amend the Transportation Code, Division II, Section 801(c) to update parking restricted hours on portions of 11th Street unless authorized by the Department of Public Health or the Fire Department to conduct inspections of mobile food facilities.

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors amends Transportation Code, Division II, Section 801(c) to amend the existing no stopping except exempt vehicles restriction on the east side of 11th Street from 67 to 133 feet north of Mission Street from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

[Transportation Code – 11th Street Parking Restrictions]

Resolution amending Division II of the Transportation Code to expand the time period during which, and adjust the area where, parking is prohibited on a portion of 11th Street north of Mission Street unless authorized by the Department of Public Health or Fire Department.

The Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors of the City and County of San Francisco enacts the following regulations:

Section 1. Article 800 of Division II of the Transportation Code is hereby amended by revising Section 801, to read as follows:

SEC. 801. PARKING RESTRICTIONS BY LOCATION.

- (a) It shall be a violation of Division I, Section 7.2.42 (Parking Restrictions) for any person to Park any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, in any of the locations listed below during times when Parking is restricted without displaying a valid permit for Parking in that location. A permit issued for Parking pursuant to this Article does not exempt a vehicle from street-cleaning Parking restrictions. These parking restrictions shall not apply to any state, federal, or foreign consulate vehicle parked to carry out official government business.
- (b) Removal Authorized. Pursuant to the authority of Vehicle Code Section22651(n) any vehicle Parked in violation of this Section 801 may be removed by the SFMTA
