<u>300 block of Bryant Street between 2nd Street and Rincon Street</u> ESTABLISH - RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA Y (Eligibility only, no signs) 300 block of Bryant Street includes 461 2nd Street (Supervisor District 6) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Gerry Porras, gerry.porras@sfmta.com

The proposed modification would add RPP eligibility to the residents of the 300 block of Bryant Street includes 461 2nd Street (300 block of Bryant Street between 2nd Street and Rincon Street) so they can purchase parking permits for their vehicle to park within RPP Area Y Note: Southeast side of Bryant Street (301 to 353) are already in RPP Area Y.

2. Decatur Street from Bryant Street

ESTABLISH - RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA U (Eligibility only, no signs) Decatur Street from Bryant Street – East Side (Supervisor District 6) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Gerry Porras, gerry.porras@sfmta.com

The proposed modification would add RPP eligibility to the residents of Decatur Street from Bryant Street with no parking restrictions on the east side, (No Parking 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.), and (No Parking Any Time) on the west side of the street so they can purchase parking permits for their vehicle to park within RPP Area U

3. <u>Clement Street at 24th Avenue</u> ESTABLISH – STOP SIGNS

Clement Street, eastbound and westbound, at 24th Avenue, making this intersection an all-way STOP (Supervisor District 1) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Andre Wright, Andre.wright@sfmta.com

SFMTA proposes additional STOP signs, making this intersection an all-way STOP.

4. <u>3rd Street, west side, south of 20th Street</u>

RESCIND – TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANY TIME

ESTABLISH – GENERAL METERED PARKING, 4-HOUR TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY

3rd Street, west side, from 384 feet to 482 feet south of 20th Street (98 feet total) (Supervisor District 10) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Juan Hernandez, juan.hernandez@sfmta.com

Proposal to re-purpose 98 feet of existing Tow-Away, No Stopping Any Time to general metered parking to increase available parking.

5. <u>Clay Street at Battery Street – Sidewalk Bike Share Station</u> ESTABLISH – SIDEWALK BIKE SHARE STATION Clay Street, south side, from 20 feet to 120 feet east of Battery Street (Supervisor District 3) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Laura Stonehill, laura.stonehill@sfmta.com

Proposal to expand the sidewalk Bay Wheels bike share station on Clay Street at Battery Street by adding docks to the west of the existing station.

6. <u>Market Street at Bush Street – Sidewalk Bike Share Station</u> ESTABLISH – SIDEWALK BIKE SHARE STATION

Market Street, north side, from 47 feet to 107 feet east of Bush Street (Supervisor District 3) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Laura Stonehill, laura.stonehill@sfmta.com

Proposal to expand the sidewalk Bay Wheels bike share station at Mechanic's Plaza by adding another row of docks between street trees.

ADJOURNMENT

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Whether the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, this decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If a City Traffic Engineer disapproves a parking or traffic modification and a member



of the public requests SFMTA review of that decision, the additional review shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. City Traffic Engineer decisions will be posted on <u>SFMTA.com/EngineeringResults</u> by 5 p.m. on the Friday following the public hearing. Final SFMTA Decisions involving certain parking or traffic modifications, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to <u>Ordinance 127-18</u>.
