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# PURPOSE

To approve various routine parking and traffic modifications.

# STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS AND TRANSIT FIRST POLICY PRINCIPLES:

- 4. Make streets safer for everyone.
- 5. Deliver reliable and equitable transportation services.
- 6. Eliminate pollution and greenhouse gas emissions by increasing use of transit, walking, and bicycling.

This action supports the following SFMTA Transit First Policy Principles:

- 1. To ensure quality of life and economic health in San Francisco, the primary objective of the transportation system must be the safe and efficient movement of people and goods.
- 2. Public transit, including taxis and vanpools, is an economically and environmentally sound alternative to transportation by individual automobiles. Within San Francisco, travel by public transit, by bicycle and on foot must be an attractive alternative to travel by private automobile.
- 3. Decisions regarding the use of limited public street and sidewalk space shall encourage the use of public rights of way by pedestrians, bicyclists, and public transit, and shall strive to reduce traffic and improve public health and safety.

## ITEMS

The following items were considered at Public Hearing on July 5, 2024

A. ESTABLISH – RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA U (Eligibility only, no signs) 100 block of Stillman Street, 475 4th Street and 550-560 Bryant Street (Requested by residents).

Modification A would add RPP eligibility to the residents of the 100 block of Stillman Street between 3rd and 4th Streets, including 475 4th Street and 550-560 Bryant Street so they can purchase parking permits for their vehicle to park within RPP Area U. Note: 101 and 147 Stillman Street are already in RPP Area U.

B. ESTABLISH – TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANY TIME, Hooper Street, south side, from 8th Street to 500 feet easterly, Irwin Street, south side, from 7th Street to 430 feet westerly (Requested by Public Works).

Modification B would establish Tow-Away, No Stopping Any Time restrictions, in conjunction with other loading and red zone changes, on the south side of Hooper Street, from 8th Street towards midblock 7th Street, due to the completed building project on the north side of Hooper Street (188 Hooper). The remaining parking legislation on both Hooper

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Street and Irwin Street are due to the sidewalk improvements for the new 1140 7th Street building site.

## **ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW**

The proposed traffic and parking modifications are subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). CEQA provides a categorical exemption from environmental review for operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301.

The SFMTA, under authority delegated by the San Francisco Planning Department, has determined that the proposed parking and traffic modifications in Item A (Case No. 2024-006054ENV, June 24, 2024) is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301.

The proposed action is the Approval Action for Item A as defined by San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 31.

California Public Resources Code section 21083.3 and CEQA Guidelines section 15183 provide that projects that are consistent with the development density established by existing zoning, community plan or general plan policies for which an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) was certified, shall not be subject to additional environmental review except as might be necessary to examine whether there are project- specific significant effects which are peculiar to the project or its site. Section 15183(c) specifies that if an impact is not peculiar to the parcel or to the proposed project, then an EIR need not be prepared for the project solely on the basis of that impact.

On July 28, 2018, the Planning Department issued a Community Plan Evaluation for the 188 Hooper Street/111 8th Street/1140 7th Street Project (Item B, Case No. 2016-001557ENV-02) pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 21083.3.

WHEREAS, The public has been notified about the proposed modifications and has been given the opportunity to comment on those modifications through the public hearing process; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors adopts these CEQA findings as its own; a copy of the CEQA findings and the CEQA determinations are on file with the Secretary to the SFMTA Board of Directors, and may be found in the records of the Planning Department at <u>https://sfplanning.org/</u> and 49 South Van Ness Avenue, Suite 1400 in San Francisco, and is incorporated herein by reference; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors, upon recommendation of the Director of Transportation and the Director of the Streets Division approves the changes.
