Steve Ferrer commented about educating at high schools.

Speaker commented on a system for hiring, an education program and starter homes for officers.

Jodie Medeiros thanked staff for working together on Vision Zero.

Luke Bornheimer presented questions about officers, speed enforcement, data, and enforcement.

7. Presentation and discussion regarding the Vision Zero Severe Injury Trends Report 2011 – 2022. (Explanatory documents include a slide presentation.)

Iris Tsui, SFDPH Vision Zero Epidemiologist, presented the item.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Jodie Mederios commented on the presented data and expressed concern about injuries and youth.

Speaker asked about e-bikes.

Speaker expressed concern about data not being captured by other hospitals.

Luke Bornheimer presented questions about the data and fatalities.

Uyen Ngo, Vision Zero Program Manager, and Shannon Hake, Speed Safety Camera Program Manager, presented the item.

Jodie Mederios asked about the proposed improvements and timelines and urged the SFMTA to partner with the VZ Coalition.

Luke Bornheimer commented on safety, mode share, and infrastructure.



Speaker shared about artificial intelligence and was optimistic about the future.

Josie Domiguez Chan shared about Walk SF and Sunday Streets.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call 415.554.5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

<u>Board of Supervisors review of certain SFMTA Decisions:</u> Certain parking and traffic modifications as well as Private Transportation Programs that involve certain parking modifications can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors. These decisions are subject to review within 30 calendar days after they are made by the SFMTA Board of Directors.
