#### ORDER OF BUSINESS

#### 1. Call to Order

Chairman Nolan called the meeting to order at 1:02 p.m.

#### 2. Roll Call

- Present: Cheryl Brinkman Gwyneth Borden Malcolm Heinicke – absent at Roll Call Jerry Lee Tom Nolan Joél Ramos Cristina Rubke
- 3. Announcement of prohibition of sound producing devices during the meeting.

Chairman Nolan announced that the ringing of and use of cell phones, pagers and similar soundproducing electronic devices are prohibited at the meeting. He advised that any person responsible for the ringing or use of a cell phone, pager, or other similar sound-producing electronic devices might be removed from the meeting. He also advised that cell phones that are set on "vibrate" cause microphone interference and requested that they be placed in the "off" position.

#### 4. Approval of Minutes

On motion to approve the minutes of the August 19, 2014 Regular Meeting unanimously approved (Heinicke-absent).

#### 5. Communications

Board Secretary Boomer stated that Item 10.2A regarding establishing a traffic signal at 4<sup>th</sup> and Irving had previously been legislated and so it has been removed from the agenda. The other locations that are part of 10.2A are still on the agenda for consideration. In addition, there would be no discussion of anticipated litigation in closed session.

#### 6. Introduction of New or Unfinished Business by Board Members

Vice Chairman Brinkman requested an update of enforcement with respect to transit only lanes.

Director Heinicke arrived.

9. Public Comment

Hansu Kim discussed TNC vehicles. It's unfair to be a regulated taxi business and competing with other services that have another set of rules. There are no controls over the number of cars on the street, insurance requirements, types of vehicle used or the number of drivers. There are minimal requirements for these new services and these companies can charge whatever they like. He asked the Board what their plan is to have the taxi industry survive in this environment.

Herbert Weiner shared memories of Vera Haile. He also discussed the contempt shown for the elderly in San Francisco by making them walk longer distances to public transportation.

Jim Gillespie agreed with the comments expressed by Mr. Kim. He expressed concern about the number of vehicles on the street picking up people on demand. These vehicles are supposed to be regulated by the CPUC but there's no enforcement. There's nothing wrong with new innovation but the real issue is that the playing field isn't level.

Tone Lee stated that the taxi business needs to be restructured before the end of the year. The SFMTA has to protect taxi drivers and not let the medallion system collapse before it's too late. It will be big trouble if taxi drivers can't make their payments. Taxi drivers can survive if costs are lowered.

- (10.1) Approving the following traffic modifications:
  - A. ESTABLISH NO PARKING ANYTIME Mission Street, north side, from 27 feet west of Whittier Street to 21 feet east of Whittier Street; Mission Street, south side, from Whittier Street to 21 feet easterly; Mission Street, north side, from Whipple Avenue to 21 feet easterly; Mission Street, south side, from Whipple Avenue to 21 feet easterly; and Mission Street, south side, from Lowell Street to 21 feet westerly.
  - B. RESCIND FLAG STOP Inbound Bridgeview Drive, south side, 73 feet east of Scotia Avenue and Thornton Avenue.
  - C. ESTABLISH FLAG STOP Thornton Avenue, south side, at Scotia Avenue.
  - D. ESTABLISH STOP SIGNS Moraga Street, eastbound and westbound, at 31st Avenue.
  - E. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA N, 2-HOUR PARKING 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY Balboa Street, both sides, between 10th Avenue and 11th Avenue.
  - F. ESTABLISH NO LEFT TURN Duboce Avenue, eastbound, at Valencia Street.
  - G. ESTABLISH RED ZONE Valencia Street, east side, from Duboce Avenue to 26 feet southerly.
  - H. ESTABLISH 15 MILES PER HOUR SCHOOL SPEED LIMIT WHEN CHILDREN ARE PRESENT Page Street, between Baker Street and Broderick Street.
  - I. ESTABLISH NO U-TURN, 7:00 AM TO 9:00 AM, 2:30 PM TO 4:00 PM, SCHOOL DAYS Page Street, westbound, at Baker Street; and Page Street, eastbound, at Broderick St.
  - J. RESCIND MIDBLOCK CROSSWALK Napoleon Street, from 930 feet to 946 feet east of Jerrold Avenue.
  - K. ESTABLISH MIDBLOCK CROSSWALK Napoleon Street, from 1,000 feet to 1,016 feet east of Jerrold Avenue. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution. The proposed action is an Approval Action as defined by S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31.)

(10.2) Approving the following traffic and parking modifications to implement various projects along rapid Muni transit routes included in the Transit Effectiveness Project's Service-Related Capital Improvements and Travel Time Reduction Proposals:

- A. ESTABLISH NEW TRAFFIC SIGNALS 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Irving Street; 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Judah Street; 47<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Fulton Street; Cesar Chavez and Church Streets; Fulton Street and La Playa; Laguna and McAllister Streets; and Cayuga Street and Geneva Avenue.
- B. ESTABLISH TRANSIT/COMMERCIAL VEHICLE-ONLY LANE, 6 AM TO 8 PM, EVERYDAY Sansome Street, southbound, from Broadway to Washington Street
- C. ESTABLISH NO PARKING ANYTIME Sansome Street, west side, from Washington Street to 27 feet northerly; and Sansome Street, west side, from Pacific Avenue to 20 feet northerly.
- D. ESTABLISH BUS ZONE and ESTABLISH NO PARKING ANYTIME Sansome Street, west side, from Jackson Street to 67 feet southerly.
- E. ESTABLISH FLAG STOP Broadway, west side, nearside at Sansome Street.
- F. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY NO STOPPING ANYTIME, 6 AM TO 8 PM, EVERYDAY, EXCEPT METERED COMMERCIAL LOADING - Sansome Street, west side, from 26 feet to 255 feet south of Broadway; Sansome Street, west side, from Pacific Avenue to Jackson Street; and Sansome Street, west side, from 133 feet to 153 feet south of Jackson St.

- G. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY NO STOPPING ANYTIME, 6 AM TO 8 PM, EVERYDAY, EXCEPT METERED COMMERCIAL LOADING FOR TRUCKS WITH 6 WHEELS OR MORE - Sansome Street, west side, from 184 feet to 228 feet south of Jackson Street.
- H. RESCIND TOW-AWAY NO STOPPING ANY TIME, 7 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT METERED COMMERCIAL LOADING FOR TRUCKS WITH 6 WHEELS OR MORE - Washington Street, north side, from 110 feet to 152 feet west of Sansome Street.
- I. RESCIND TOW-AWAY NO STOPPING ANYTIME, 7 AM TO 3 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT COMMERCIAL LOADING Sansome Street, east side, from 71 feet to 115 feet north of Jackson Street.
- J. RESCIND TOW-AWAY NO STOPPING ANYTIME, 7 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT COMMERCIAL LOADING - Washington Street, north side, from 152 feet to 196 feet west of Sansome Street; Jackson Street, south side, from 128 feet to 173 feet west of Sansome Street; Pacific Avenue, south side, from 108 feet to 150 feet west of Sansome Street; Pacific Avenue, south side, from 239 feet to 261 feet west of Sansome Street; Pacific Avenue, north side, from 12 feet to 40 feet east of Sansome Street; and Broadway, south side, from 188 feet to 228 feet west of Sansome Street.
- K. ESTABLISH –SHORT TERM METERED GREEN ZONE Sansome Street, east side, from 78 feet to 96 feet south of Broadway; and Jackson Street, north side, from 69 feet to 83 feet west of Sansome Street.
- L. ESTABLISH NO RIGHT TURN ON RED Broadway, eastbound, at Sansome Street
- M. ESTABLISH BLUE ZONE Pacific Avenue, north side, from 6 feet to 28 feet west of Battery Street; Washington Street, south side, from Battery Street to 24 feet westerly; Montgomery Street, east side, from 16 feet to 38 feet north of Washington Street; Montgomery Street, west side, from 7 feet to 29 feet south of Jackson Street; Pacific Avenue, north side, from 13 feet to 35 feet west of Front Street; Jackson Street, south side, from 21 feet to 40 feet east of Columbus Avenue; and Pacific Avenue, north side, from 12 feet to 34 feet west of Montgomery. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)

<u>California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31</u>: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.
