Project Goals

- SFPUC: Reduce the amount of stormwater going into the combined sewer system
- SFMTA: Improve conditions for people who walk, bike and live along the Wiggle
 - Ensure that pedestrians feel safe crossing the street
 - Minimize congestion from motor vehicles
 - Encourage slow, safe speeds from all roadway users

Proposed Elements


- Bulb-Outs (curb extensions)
- Permeable Paving
- Raised Crosswalks
- Rain Gardens

Divisadero Improvements

- Traffic signals coordinated for southbound travel between O'Farrell and Hayes so that southbound traffic will usually arrive on a green light.
- Left turns prohibited at several streets, to reduce clogging and prioritize through-traffic.

Project Timeline

- Planning May 2013 to Jan 2014
- Environmental Review Feb 2014 to March 2015
- Legislation March to April 2015
- Detailed Design May to Nov 2015
- Bid/Award/Construction Dec 2015 to Dec 2016
