ORDER OF BUSINESS

1. Call to Order

Chairman Nolan called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m.

2. Roll Call

3. Announcement of prohibition of sound producing devices during the meeting.

Chairman Nolan announced that the ringing of and use of cell phones, pagers and similar sound-producing electronic devices are prohibited at the meeting. He advised that any person responsible for the ringing or use of a cell phone, pager, or other similar sound-producing electronic devices might be removed from the meeting. He also advised that cell phones that are set on "vibrate" cause microphone interference and requested that they be placed in the "off" position.

Director Borden stated that some buses continue to mention stops that are no longer there and asked staff to correct the system. She also requested information regarding the maintenance schedule for the bus shelters.

Ed Reiskin, Director of Transportation, discussed Chairman Nolan's recent award at the American Public Transportation Association's Annual Meeting as "Transit Board Member of the Year"; changes to Arguello Blvd.; Vision Zero efforts and accomplishments; the start of the Van Ness and Polk Street projects; Muni Heritage Weekend and the dedication of Unity Plaza.

8. Citizens' Advisory Council Report

Daniel Weaver, Chairman, Citizen's Advisory Council, presented the report.

9. Public Comment

Eileen Boken questioned whether the SFMTA was looking forward when they rebranded the Transit Effectiveness Project as "Muni Forward" or if it was just a public relations exercise. She discussed installing LED lights on light rail vehicles to help people see trains. It will save lives. Mr. Haley credited the suggestion about the lights to comments he heard at a community meeting.

Tom Gilberti stated that riders who board the commuter shuttle buses should have a valid Muni pass because they are using city streets. They need to contribute to Muni and other city services. A few weeks ago a man had a stroke and he had to push the wheelchair off the bus. The driver could have helped but he didn't. Drivers should be able to handle somebody in a wheelchair and help out. When the SFMTA reduces stops, it adds ten minutes of travel time for senior citizens.

Sean Kennedy, Manager, Transit Planning, presented the item.

Ashley Summers, Aide to Supervisor Tang, expressed appreciation to residents, small business owners, and others as well as SFMTA staff and the Board. The Project has the potential to improve transit reliability. Some residents don't want stops to be removed and are concerned about the impact to businesses. The SFMTA had a thorough outreach process and the project changed as a result. Safety is non-negotiable. Ms. Summers expressed support for boarding islands and urged the SFMTA to do a comprehensive parking study. The Supervisor doesn't feel that transit only lanes are warranted. She urged the SFMTA to work with local businesses to minimize impacts during the construction phase.

Jarlene Choy, on behalf of Supervisor Norman Yee, expressed appreciation to the community and staff for their outreach efforts. She expressed support and concern for the project. She asked that both the 15th and 17th Ave. stops be kept for access and safety. The Supervisor urges early

implementation of the proposals, and a six month evaluation program before any final decisions are made.

Carmen Chiu, Assessor, expressed support for the non-permanent pilot project. She urged the Board to not pre-approve solutions before the pilot and see whether it would be effective. This will build trust with the community. She urged the SFMTA to evaluate parking and traffic flows on Taraval and on side streets as there may be other options. She expressed opposition to perpendicular parking and transit only lanes.

Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.
