4. Public Comment

Edward Mason stated that the commuter shuttle program is a burden on the neighborhood. On his way to the meeting, he saw a bus idle for five minutes. Buses still operate on restricted streets and impede Muni. It took providing 350 comments to establish two white zones, which will result in the loss of parking meter revenue. He suggested that there be a staging area outside of the neighborhoods. There was no public notice that bike sharing would cause three parking spaces to be removed.

Ed Reiskin, Director of Transportation, and various SFMTA staff presented the item.
