- G. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY NO PARKING ANYTIME Diamond Street (North), east side, from Diamond Heights Boulevard to 117 feet northerly. **PH 8/18/17 Requested by Resident**

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H. ESTABLISH – TOW-AWAY NO PARKING ANYTIME – Monterey Boulevard, south side, from Plymouth Avenue to 76 feet westerly (along island). PH 8/18/17 Requested by SFMTA

- D. ESTABLISH STOP SIGN Brosnan Street, westbound, at Guerrero Street.
- E. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA N, 2-HOUR PARKING, 9 AM TO 6 PM MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT VEHICLES WITH AREA N PERMITS – 9th Avenue, both sides, between Anza Street and Geary Boulevard.
- F. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY NO PARKING ANYTIME 26<sup>th</sup> Street, south side, from Valencia Street to 39 feet easterly.
- G. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY NO PARKING ANYTIME Diamond Street, east side, from Diamond Heights Boulevard to 117 feet northerly.
- H. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY NO PARKING ANYTIME Monterey Boulevard, south side, from Plymouth Avenue to 76 feet westerly.
