Racial Equity Report at July 18, 2023 MTA Board of Directors (MTAB) Meeting

Every quarter, the Chief Equity Officer is responsible for sharing SFMTA <u>Racial Equity Action Plan</u> updates with the MTA Board of Directors. This is to ensure that at the highest levels of leadership, there is accountability to achieve the agency's strategic goals to advance equity. On July 18, Chief Equity Officer, Josephine Ayankoya, co-presented the Racial Equity Report with Rashid Herd, Workforce Development Director. Within the Phase One <u>Racial Equity Action Plan</u>, Rashid is responsible for implementing 22 actions, while the larger Workforce Development team is responsible for many more actions in the Phase One REAP focused on internal equity. This collaborative presentation is the first of many that will leverage mandated reporting to the Board to highlight the many Phase One REAP Action Leads working on the agencies stated goals.

The joint presentation focused on the racial equity strategy for pipeline and pathway programs, shared updates on racial equity training for leaders in Fiscal Year 2022 - 2023, and paid tribute to the memory of departed SFMTA Apprenticeship Program Manager Margot Reed. Opportunities in Transportation Equity



Transportation Justice Fellowship Application Now Open--National Association of City Transportation Officials(NACTO)

Transportation justice aims to provide all communities with access to safe, reliable, affordable, and equitable transportation, connecting people to the places, resources, and opportunities they need to thrive.

The Transportation Justice Fellowship is designed to support US-based early- and mid-career professionals of color who are working to embed mobility justice in transportation agency priorities and beyond.

The Fellowship—overseen by NACTO along with the Better Bike Share Partnership—will include 50 hours of programming for eight Fellows, who will receive training from an experienced consultant team, visits from transportation experts, and one-on-one coaching sessions. This year's Fellowship will focus on shared micromobility as a critical tool for operationalizing equity and transportation justice.
