 ESTABLISH - RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA U (Eligibility only, no signs)
 100 block of Stillman Street, 475 4th Street and 550-560 Bryant Street (Supervisor District 6)
 (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Gerry Porras, gerry.porras@sfmta.com

The proposed modification would add RPP eligibility to the residents of the 100 block of Stillman Street between 3rd and 4th Streets, including 475 4th Street and 550-560 Bryant Street so they can purchase parking permits for their vehicle to park within RPP Area U Note: 101 and 147 Stillman Street are already in RPP Area U

2. <u>Brunsick Street & Roemer Way Intersection – Stop Sign</u> ESTABLISH – STOP SIGN

Proposal to stop the stem of the T-intersection to clarify the right-of-way.

9th Street at Bryant Street - Red Zone

3(a). RESCIND - METERED MOTORCYCLE PARKING

9th Street, west side, from 24 feet to 52 feet north of Bryant Street (removes 28-foot zone of meters 454, 456, 458, 460, 462, 464, 466, 468)

3(b). ESTABLISH - RED ZONE

9th Street, west side, from Bryant Street to 32 feet northerly

3(c). ESTABLISH – GENERAL METERED PARKING, 2-HOUR LIMIT, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY

9th Street, west side, from 32 feet to 52 feet north of Bryant Street (Supervisor District 6) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Eric Luu, eric.luu@sfmta.com

Proposal to remove motorcycle parking and green zone to accommodate Muni bus Turns.

Categorically exempt from Environmental Review: CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 Class 1(c): Operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities.

The following items have been environmentally cleared by the Planning Department on June 28, 2018, 188 Hooper Street/111 8th Street/1140 7th Street Notice of Exemption (2016-001557ENV-02):

Hooper Street and Irwin Street, between 7th Street and 8th Street

4(a). ESTABLISH - TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANY TIME

Hooper Street, south side, from 8th Street to 500 feet easterly Irwin Street, south side, from 7th Street to 430 feet westerly (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board)

4(b). ESTABLISH – GENERAL LOADING ZONE, 5-MINUTE LIMIT, AT ALL TIMES

Hooper Street, south side, from 109 feet to 252 feet west of 7th Street (143-foot zone) Hooper Street, south side, from 262 feet to 317 feet west of 7th Street (55-foot zone) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer)

4(c). ESTABLISH - RED ZONE

- **A.** Hooper Street, south side, from 7th Street to 29 feet westerly
- **B.** Hooper Street, south side, from 71 feet to 109 feet west of 7th Street
- **C.** Hooper Street, south side, from 252 feet to 262 feet west of 7th Street
- **D.** Irwin Street, north side, from 7th Street to 22 feet westerly
- **E.** Irwin Street, north side, from 73 feet to 126 feet west of 7th Street
- **F.** Irwin Street, north side, from 262 feet to 272 feet west of 7th Street
- **G.**Irwin Street, north side, from 374 feet to 409 feet west of 7th Street (Supervisor District 6) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Norman Wong, norman.wong@sfmta.com

Proposal to legislate parking changes on the south side of Hooper Street, from 8th Street towards midblock 7th Street, due to the completed building project on the north side of Hooper Street (188 Hooper). The remaining parking legislation on both Hooper Street and Irwin Street are due to the sidewalk improvements for the new 1140 7th Street building site.

ADJOURNMENT

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Whether the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, this decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If a City Traffic Engineer disapproves a parking or traffic modification and a member of the public requests SFMTA review of that decision, the additional review shall be conducted pursuant to Division II,



Section 203 of the Transportation Code. City Traffic Engineer decisions will be posted on <u>SFMTA.com/EngineeringResults</u> by 5 p.m. on the Friday following the public hearing. Final SFMTA Decisions involving certain parking or traffic modifications, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to <u>Ordinance 127-18</u>.
