- Muni customers can purchase one-way Muni transfers at the AT&T Park ticket windows located at 2nd and King streets and Willie Mays Plaza. Transfers will be sold from two hours before the game until the game begins, and again from the beginning of the 7th inning until 30 minutes after the game ends.
- Baseball fans transferring from BART may purchase round trip Muni transfer tickets at the Embarcadero Station two and a half hours prior to the start time of the game.
- Transfers will be valid for up to two hours after the end of event.

Muni Ticket Sales - In Person

Muni customers may purchase their fare in advance, on-board vehicles and at any Muni ticket vending machine.

Use of Clipper® Card

Event participants are encouraged to use Clipper® Card to get to AT&T Park. Customers using Bay Area public transportation systems are strongly encouraged to purchase their fares in advance or use Clipper® Card to attend the event. Customers using a Clipper Card receive 50 cents off an adult single ride when transferring to Muni from BART, Golden Gate Ferry and Transit, and San Francisco Bay Ferry routes (Oakland-Alameda, Harbor Bay and Vallejo). Golden Gate Ferry and Transit and San Francisco Bay Ferry provide the same discount on return trips.

Special Event Parking Rates

As a reminder to fans, in order to reduce congestion on city streets after all events at AT&T Park, the SFMTA will close eastbound King Street between 3rd and 2nd streets from the seventh inning until after the post-game traffic has died down. Additionally, the northbound portion of the 4th Street (Peter R. Maloney) Bridge will be closed to all traffic except streetcars, buses, taxis and bicycles during the post-game period. Giants fans parked south of Mission Creek Channel who are heading north of the channel are encouraged to exit to the south along 3rd or 4th streets in order to avoid congestion on King and 3rd streets after AT&T Park events.

Dreamforce Convention

Next week, Wednesday, September 19, through Saturday, September 29: A street closure of Howard Street between 3rd and 4th streets will be required for the Dreamforce Convention beginning at 8 p.m., Wednesday, September 19 and continuing through 8 p.m., Saturday, September 29.

Tuesday, September 25 through Friday, September 28: The Salesforce Corporation will be holding its yearly Dreamforce Convention at the Moscone Center. Conference hours will be from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., each day. An attendance of 60,000 is expected to attend workshops and product demonstrations at Moscone Center North, South and West.

Significant traffic congestion is anticipated in and around Moscone Center between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. daily for the duration of the closure. Travelers are encouraged to take public transportation or use alternate routes. There will be heavy pedestrian traffic in the area.

Howard Street traffic will be detoured via southbound 2nd Street to Harrison Street, or via New Montgomery Street to Hawthorne Street to either Folsom or Harrison streets.

There will be signed bicycle detour for people on bikes on Howard Street to turn north at 2nd Street to Market Street. People on bikes who wish to stay on Howard Street will have the option to dismount at Howard and 3rd streets and walk their bicycle through the event along the north sidewalk.

Signage will be placed in advance of the street closures and detour routes.

Caltrans will activate electronic message signs on major freeways entering the city to notify motorists of the closures.

SFMTA Parking Control Officers and San Francisco Police Officers will be deployed at key intersections throughout the closures.

NEW: J Church Track Maintenance Project

Starting Monday, September 17 and continue for about three weeks, J Church track maintenance work will take place at the intersection of 23rd and Church streets. During construction, the J Church rail service will operate as normal. Church Street will remain open, eastbound and westbound lanes on 23rd Street may be closed occasionally and traffic approaching the intersection will be detoured.

Work hours are from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Saturday.

During construction hours, 10 parking spaces **will not be available** near the job site. **Additional six parking spaces will be removed** for staging 24 hours a day for the duration of the project.

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project

The Van Ness Improvement Project is a civic improvement project that will bring San Francisco's first Bus Rapid Transit system. To maximize the benefits of construction, the City will also be replacing major utilities including water, sewer and emergency firefighting water systems. Work will also be done to repave Van Ness Avenue, enhance streetlights and landscaping, and install new sidewalk lighting and rain gardens.

Traffic lanes on Van Ness Avenue have been shifted to create two construction zones for upcoming utility work. Because some of this work requires reducing Van Ness Avenue to one lane in each direction, some work is limited to nighttime hours.

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project *continued*

Friday, September 14, between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.:

- **From Geary to O'Farrell streets:** Crews are scheduled to work on updating the emergency firefighting water system. Disruptive noise is expected.
- **On Mission Street:** Crews are scheduled to prepare the area for upcoming sewer work.

Neighbors are advised to anticipate construction-related noise as crews work diligently to complete necessary night work.

UPDATE: Central Subway Project

Construction of the 4th and Brannan streets surface station platform is ongoing. Until further notice, traffic reroutes will remain in effect. **Street restoration work has tentatively been scheduled to start on Monday, September 17 at the intersection of 4th and Brannan streets. This may affect traffic and pedestrian movement at the intersection. The work is scheduled to take place between 9 a.m. and 5 a.m. and may last several days.**

Sewer replacement work continues Monday through Friday, from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. at 4th and Howard streets. Two through lanes are in place southbound 4th Street. Westbound traffic on Howard Street may be impacted.

One lane on the south side of Ellis Street is open at all times for eastbound traffic. The parking garage between Ellis and O'Farrell is accessible on the north side of Ellis Street. Street and sidewalk restoration work continues on the north side of the intersection of Ellis and Stockton streets, as well as on O'Farrell east of Stockton.

Washington Street between Stockton Street and Trenton Alley is under a long-term temporary closure to vehicular traffic as station construction continues. Pedestrian access to Washington Street between Stockton Street and Trenton Alley remains open. The pedestrian walkway scaffolding along the west side of Stockton Street south of Washington Street may be disassembled in the coming weeks, Pedestrian access through this area will be temporarily rerouted.

The Central Subway project is the first underground line to link the north and south corridors of the city, and will provide a direct connection to major retail, sporting and cultural venues while efficiently transporting people to jobs, educational opportunities and other amenities throughout San Francisco.

UPDATE: Twin Peaks Tunnel Improvements Project

After two months of construction, the 100 year-old Twin Peaks Tunnel reopened as scheduled on Saturday, August 25.

To complete the electrical work, there will be an overnight closure to West Portal, Forest Hill, Castro and Church stations this weekend. During the closure:

- **Church, Castro, Forest Hill and West Portal stations will close at 11:59 p.m., Friday, September 14 and will reopen at 8 a.m., Saturday, September 15.**
- **Church, Castro, Forest Hill and West Portal stations will close at 11:59 p.m., Saturday, September 15 and will reopen at 8 a.m., Sunday, September 16.**

Bus shuttles will be provided on the K, L and M lines while additional electrical upgrades are done.

The tunnel's infrastructure, including the tracks, walls and drainage systems were updated to keep up with the demands of the Muni system. With new tracks, the tunnel's previous speed restriction will be lifted and will keep trains running reliably through the system. Seismic reinforcements and fire safety enhancements were done to better protect the tunnel's overall structure and stability.

Last but not least, four new track crossovers were installed in the tunnel that allow the train to switch from one track to the other during service delays and can assist improving overall train operations by adding flexibility.

ONGOING: UCSF Mission Bay Arena Platform Project

In anticipation of the new Golden State Warriors' Chase Center and growth in the Mission Bay, the SFMTA is constructing a new center platform along 3rd Street between South and 16th streets. This new, larger platform will service both inbound and outbound trains and greatly expand transit capacity in preparation for large crowds.

Construction work is ongoing, with decommission of the Muni platform planned for mid-November and a new platform anticipated to be completed and in service in early summer of 2019. Bus substitutions will serve the T-Third line during parts of construction.

ONGOING: Howard Street Closure

Now through Sunday, September 30: Howard Street between 3rd and 4th streets is closed to vehicular traffic since 6 a.m., Tuesday, September 11 through 8 p.m., Sunday, September 30. This closure encompasses the Global Climate Action Summit, Moscone Center construction work and the annual closure for the Salesforce conference at Moscone, Dreamforce.

Heavier than normal traffic should be anticipated throughout the closure period from 2nd to 4th streets between Market and Harrison streets. Vehicular and bicycle detours are posted.

ONGOING: Construction of Mission Bay Loop

The SFMTA has resumed construction on 18th, 19th and Illinois streets, the project is expected to be completed in late 2018.

The Mission Bay Loop is a key component for San Francisco's T Third rail line and is critical to operating the T Third Central Subway service plan. The loop provides turn-around capabilities for the T Third Street light rail line via a connection of trackway from 3rd Street to 18th, Illinois and 19th streets, which will allow the SFMTA to operate the necessary service levels needed to support current and planned growth within the eastern portion of San Francisco.

ONGOING: Construction of Mission Bay Loop *continued*

Traffic, including travelling by bike, may be affected by the construction work. All work areas will be clearly marked and there will be flaggers to help direct traffic.

In order to conduct the work, parking on both sides including along the historical Crane Cove Park fence (east side of Illinois Street) will be removed 24 hours, 7 days a week from 18th to 19th and Illinois streets for the duration of the project.

Traffic lanes traveling both north and south will remain open and there will be flaggers posted to help direct traffic. The northbound bike lane will be converted to a shared roadway. Expect minor delays when traveling around and through the construction area.

Local access to properties along the project site will be maintained. Sewer work is scheduled to be completed by summer 2018.

Bus Shuttles Substitute Powell-Mason Cable Car

Friday, September 21 through Saturday, September 29: To accommodate the Muni Cable Car Gearbox Rehabilitation Project, bus shuttles will substitute the Powell-Mason Line along the northern route from Powell to Washington streets to Taylor Street at Francisco Street. Bus service will begin at 10 p.m., Friday, September 21 until the end of service on Saturday, September 29. Regular cable car service will resume at the start of service on Sunday, September 30.

Throughout the duration of bus substitution for cable car service:

- All other cable car lines will operate as usual.
- Powell-Mason line customers traveling to the northern terminal at Francisco and Bay can ride Powell-Hyde Line and transfer to a bus at Powell and Washington streets to continue the rest of the trip.

Upcoming Construction

Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project

Monday, September 17 through January 2020: Crews will begin Phase Two of the Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project.

Starting Monday, September 17, 2018, the bridge will be lowered and locked in the down position. For a major part of the 15-month construction duration, the bridge will remain accessible to vehicles, pedestrians and bicyclists. Over the course of the project, there will be some instances where a full short-term bridge closure will be required to gain access to areas underneath the bridge or to safely install scaffolding above the roadway.

Starting the week of September 17, 2018, crews will also begin setting up a construction yard along the northern half of Terry A. Francois Boulevard. Private vehicle access through Terry A. Francois Boulevard between 3rd Street and the Northeast corner will be restricted. Access will remain available for emergency vehicles and bicyclists. Pedestrian access along the public right of way/sidewalk on Terry A. Francois Boulevard (i.e. to The Yard) will also be maintained.

Traffic disruptions during general rehabilitation work should be expected to be less intrusive than full long-term bridge closures. Motorists are advised to plan and allow additional travel time or use alternate routes during the rehabilitation work to reach their destination. General work hours will be from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

During the course of rehabilitation work, access for watercraft traffic under the bridge will be limited to kayaks or other vessels that can safely pass below the closed bridge. The bridge will not be raised for the duration of this phase.

Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project *continued*

Vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic across the bridge will be maintained during the rehabilitation work, except for the instances where a full bridge closure is required. Motorists are advised to be aware that travel lanes may be restricted or altered during different phases of rehabilitation work on the bridge. More information about the phasing and sequencing of the work will be provided as it gets closer to the start of construction.

Construction scheduling is subject to change due to weather delays, equipment problems and/or unforeseen field conditions.
